A5.1 Construction Charges

- E. Except as otherwise provided herein, the *terms and conditions* in this Guidebook contemplate that the type of construction required to provide the quantity and class of service involved will be determined by the Company. The applicant may be required to pay the additional costs involved where a different type of construction than that proposed by the Company is desired. (T)
- F. When attachments are made to poles of other companies in lieu of providing new pole line construction for which construction charges would be applicable under the provisions of this section, the attachment rental charges to the Company for such attachments may be assessed to the applicant(s) in whole or in part as the particular circumstances may warrant.
- G. When an applicant is so located that it is necessary to use private right-of-way to furnish service and the Company is unable to obtain the required right-of-way without cost, the applicant may be required to pay the costs incurred in securing, clearing and retaining such right-of-way.

A5.4.3 State Of Alabama Digital Network

A. General

Services for the State of Alabama's IntraLATA Digital Network provided under this Guidebook are subject to the rates, *terms and conditions* contained herein. These rates, *terms and conditions* are effective for a five year period commencing from the date of receipt of a firm order. (T)

B. Terms and Conditions (T)

1. This offering is available for IntraLATA service only, and cannot be used as access to an Interstate/InterLATA Carrier's Point of Presence.
2. This service is available within a LATA where appropriate digital facilities are available as determined by the Company.
3. *Terms and conditions* contained herein are in addition to applicable *terms and conditions* in the Private Line Guidebook or the General Exchange Guidebook. (T)
4. The rates and charges provided herein are subject to periodic review and may be increased up to a maximum of 9 percent over the five year service period.
5. If a general offering becomes effective for any service that the customer has subscribed to under this Special Service Arrangement, the customer may elect to cancel that service under this Special Service Arrangement and subscribe to that service under the general Guidebook offering without incurring termination charges under this Guidebook, provided, however, that the customer must elect a contract period under the general Guidebook offering equal to or greater than the unexpired portion of the cancelled contract.
6. The Termination Liability applicable for service provided under this Special Service Arrangement is equal to the monthly rate times the total number of months to which the customer subscribes. It is reducible 1/60 for each month of service from the date of installation. The Termination Liability applicable for additions is equal to the monthly rate times the total number of remaining contract months. It is reducible 1/(total remaining months) for each month of service from the date of installation. Termination Liability is not applicable to those items provided with a minimum service period of 30 days.
7. The State of Alabama will be subject to a one time charge for conversion of their existing network to this Digital Network configuration. This one time charge covers work effort required at the central office and customer premises for rearrangement of existing circuits, and addition of new circuits up to two hundred ninety-four (294) circuits. Included in this amount is up to two hundred fifty (250) tie line circuits and forty-four (44) OPS or FX circuits. Additions beyond these quantities will be installed based on nonrecurring charges in this Guidebook. Applicable rates and charges from the Private Line Guidebook and the General Exchange Guidebook are in addition to this one time conversion charge.

A5.5 Alabama State Government Network Services

A5.5.1 General

- A. The services herein are offered in compliance with the State of Alabama Invitation to Bid (ITB) 92-X-230010, page 5, paragraph I.5.1, which states that the IntraLATA long distance vendor will transport traffic from node switches to locations in the same Local Access and Transport Area (LATA), but outside the Local Calling area of the node. Node switches are defined as either those identified in the ITB or any additional switches which are connected via dedicated facilities to the Alabama Tandem Telecommunications Network (ATTNet) as mutually agreed upon by *the Company* and the State Government Telecommunications Division. (T)

Note 1: Represents 1 (one) voice equivalent channel per feature activated.

A5.5.1 General (Cont'd)

A5.5.2 WatsSaver Service - Alabama State Government

- A. The service is offered only in connection with:

Billing for all toll usage originating from ATTNet node locations will be rendered in a single bill to the State of Alabama Telecommunications Division. Billing for toll usage originating from locations as described in A.2. preceding, may be rendered in a single bill to the specific location, excluding that usage transported via ATTNet node locations.
- D. Individual message detail is included as part of this service.
- E. Method of Determining Monthly Usage Charges
 1. Usage is determined for each call based on minutes and tenths of minutes (or fraction thereof), with a minimum call duration of 30 seconds. This value is then multiplied by the rate per minute for the rate option selected by the customer. The resultant amount is truncated to whole cents for each call.
 2. For the billing period, the amount for each call, as determined in 1. preceding, is totaled for all lines in the billing account to determine the total usage amount to be billed.

- D.** The Company reserves the right to limit the length of any listing to one line in the directory by use of abbreviations when, in its sole judgment, the clearness of the listing and the identification of the subscriber is not impaired thereby.
- E.** One listing, except client listings, is furnished without extra charge as specified in the following:
1. each basic local exchange service line (Excluding Back-Up Line) or MultiServ service main station line
 2. each PBX trunk
 3. each ESSX service, MultiServ PLUS service, BellSouth Centrex service, or ESSX-1 NAR or NAR usage package
 4. each BellSouth Primary Rate ISDN B-Channel
- F.** When, in the sole judgment of the Company, the use of listings in excess of the listings permitted without charge as previously outlined, are needed for better identification of the subscriber, such listings may be provided without charge.
- G.** Generally, the listed address is the location of the subscriber's place of business or residence. At the subscriber's request a partial address may be shown. An address may be:
- a number(s) and/or letter(s) followed by the name of a street, a building, a shopping center/mall, apartment complex, industrial park, or similar facility
 - rural route and/or box number
 - a name of a street, building, shopping center/mall, apartment complex, industrial park, or similar facility
 - any one of the preceding followed by a community and/or state name
 - a community name only
 - omitted at the subscriber's request
- The listed address may not include P.O. Box or use of the word or abbreviation of suite, floor, or apartment before numbers used in the identification.
- An address other than the address where the service is located may be listed provided the subscriber has a comparable class of service at the address requested.
- Only the customer name and telephone number shall be published in a listing for a Family Violence Shelter. BellSouth shall not publish an address as part of the listing for a Family Violence Shelter.
- H.** Liability of the Company due to directory errors and omissions is as specified in Section A2. (T)
- I.** A record service order charge, as specified in Section A4., applies when an order is issued solely to add or change a directory listing. (T)
- J.** Directory listings can be suspended as specified in A2.3.16. However, the suspension rate shall be 50 percent of the regularly charged rate. (T)

A6.2 Business Listing

A6.2.1 General

- A. Generally, a business listing consists of a name, or dual name, a designation descriptive of the subscriber's business if not self-explanatory, the address, and the business telephone number. The main listing is ordinarily the name of the individual, firm or corporation which contracts for the service or the name under which a business is regularly conducted.

A6.2.2 Business Designation

A. Firm Name

1. The designation in a firm name business listing consists of a word or phrase, abbreviated where necessary, that describes the general character of the subscriber's business. A designation may be required when the name under which the subscriber is doing business is insufficient to indicate the character of the business.

A6.3 Residence Listing

A6.3.1 General

- A. Generally, a residence listing consists of a surname, given name, or dual name and/or initials, the address, and the telephone number. When a single name listing is requested by the subscriber, the Company may require satisfactory evidence as to the validity of the requested name. The main listing is ordinarily the name of the individual who subscribes for the service, but the listing may be in the name of a second party residing at the address where service is provided if so designated by the subscriber.

A6.4 Non-Published (Private) Listing

A6.4.1 General

- A. A non-published listing is not listed in either the alphabetical section of the Company's directory or directory assistance records and will not be furnished upon request of a calling party. However, when a call is placed from a telephone number associated with a non-published listing, the number and/or name may be disclosed if the called party has the necessary equipment for receiving and/or disclosing incoming telephone numbers and/or names.
- B. An incoming call to a subscriber with a non-published listing will be completed by the Company only when the calling party places the call by number. The Company will adhere to this practice notwithstanding any claim of emergency the calling party may present. The acceptance by the Company of the subscriber's request to furnish a non-published telephone number does not create any relationship or obligation, direct or indirect, to any person other than the subscriber.
- C. In the absence of gross negligence or willful misconduct, no liability for damages arising from publishing a non-published telephone number in the directory or disclosing said number to any person shall attach to the Company. Where a non-published listing is published in the directory, the Company's liability shall be limited to and satisfied by a refund of any monthly charges which the Company may have made for such listing. The subscriber indemnifies and saves the Company harmless against any and all claims for damages caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by the publication of a non-published listing or the disclosing of said listing information to any person.
- D. For accounting purposes, the telephone number, name, and address of a subscriber with a non-published listing will be provided to the Long Distance Carrier(s) which furnishes the subscriber long distance message telecommunications service.
- E. The telephone number, name and address of the subscriber may be disclosed in connection with E911 service, whether such service is provided by the Company or any other person. The subscriber waives any privacy interests in his telephone number, name and address in connection with E911 service.
- F. The Company may provide telephone number, name and address of a subscriber with a Non-Published number to the public safety agency certified, authorized and responsible for providing emergency notification services in the local city, county or municipality where the subscriber line associated with such number is located, pursuant to that agency's request under Emergency Service Provider Data Service (ESPDS) detailed in the *Non-Regulated Services - Pricing guide, Section N8.3*.

A7.4 Access Line Service For Payphone Service Provider Telephones

A7.4.1 Definition and Requirements

- A. Access line service for Payphone Service Provider (PSP) telephones is an exchange line service provided at the request of a subscriber for telecommunications use by the general public.
1. This access line service is provided on a flat rate basis.
 2. This access line service is provided for use with PSP noncoin-operated public telephones or PSP coin-operated public telephones.
 3. PSP telephones may utilize "store and forward" technology to complete 0+ local, intraLATA and interLATA collect-only calls from prisons or jails. All inmate telephones which offer automated collect-only service must be equipped with both an acceptance and rejection response mechanism so if neither action is taken the call is terminated and not billed.
 4. The subscriber shall be responsible for the installation, maintenance and operation of PSP telephones used in connection with this service.
 5. PSP telephones must be connected to the Company network in compliance with Part 68 of the F.C.C. Rules and Regulations.
 6. The service is furnished subject to the condition that all applicable *terms and conditions* in Section A2. will be adhered to, with the exception of A2.2.1.A and B., which restrict the use of service and prohibit payment to the customer by another for use of the service. (T)
 7. The service is provided for use by the subscriber but may be used by others when so authorized by the subscriber, provided that all such usage is subject to the provisions of this Guidebook.
 8. This service is not subject to concessions.
 9. This service may not be suspended at a reduced rate.
 10. Access line service for PSP telephones cannot be included on accounts containing other classes of service. A separate account is required for this offering at each location.
 11. This access line provides screening information to prevent the operator from allowing toll charges against the subscriber's line. The operator also cannot perform coin collecting functions.
 12. With the exception of Coin Refund and Repair Referral Service (CRS) provided in A7.10, the Company is not responsible for refunds of coins deposited in PSP coin-operated telephones.
 13. Customer-provided public telephones may only be connected to access line service for PSP telephones.
 14. The subscriber to this service will be responsible for any and all toll charges billed to the subscriber's account.

A7.4.7 Payphone Service Provider Public Inmate Calling Service (PSPICS)

- A. Access line service for PSP telephone service is provided for exclusive use of inmates (hereafter called PSP Inmate Calling Service, or (PSPICS) served within the confines of a penal, correctional or mental institution.
- B. Except as modified herein, applicable *terms, conditions* and requirements as set forth elsewhere in A7.4 for PSP telephones will apply to PSPICS. (T)
- C. Access line service for PSPICS when provided for the exclusive use of inmates may be concentrated one line to three instruments. However, if more than one instrument occupies a single access line, only one instrument may use the line at a given time.
- D. Dedicated or special access facilities, may be used in addition to the access line in C. preceding for IntraLATA and InterLATA calls.
- E. In lieu of Access Line Service as described elsewhere in A7.4, CPE stations subscribing to PSPICS are provisioned by the customer as follows:
 - 1. May be arranged to terminate calls after a certain amount of conversation time, or in cases of emergency in accordance with any Rules and Regulations *published* and upon notification to the Company of such an arrangement. The Company will not provide credit or equivalent service to the called or calling parties for such calls. (T)
 - 2. May be arranged to block access to certain telephone numbers at the facility administrator's request.
- F. Rates and charges for access line service for PSPICS are provided in A7.4.5. At the request of the facility administrator, blocking of equal access calls (10XXX or 101XXXX) may be provided on telephones for exclusive use of inmates at the rate following.

A7.4.8 BellSouth PSP Reward Plan

- A. Definition and Requirements
 - 1. The BellSouth PSP Reward Plan provides the PSP a reward, ranging from 0 to 10 percent of the full price of the service, exclusive of taxes and fees, for a term commitment of 12 or 24 months to be applied monthly, one month in arrears.
 - 2. Applicable taxes and fees will be based on the full price of all services, and no taxes or fees will be added to the amount of any reward under this program. The reward for each month will be reflected as a credit in the Other Charges and Credits section of the subscriber's BellSouth bill in the month following the month to which the reward relates.
 - 3. The BellSouth PSP Reward Plan term reward will become effective when an authorized agent of the Company executes a Letter of Intent for the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan but not prior to the approval of this Guidebook.
 - 4. The BellSouth PSP Reward Plan offers a reward on the access line rates in A7.4.5.A.1.a. preceding. The reward applied will be based on the number of PSP access lines subscribed to the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan and the term commitment agreed upon.
 - 5. The PSP must subscribe all its payphone lines to the Company's Access Line Service For Payphone Service Provider Telephones.
 - a. (DELETED)
 - b. (DELETED)
 - c. This plan does not apply to Inmate lines.
 - 6. The PSP agrees to send all 0+ local and intraLATA calls (not previously incumbered as of the effective date of this guidebook) to the Company. These calls must:
 - a. originate from a telephone line associated with the subscribing PSP's account,
 - b. originate and terminate in the same LATA,
 - c. be carried and completed by the Company via Company facilities and
 - d. be billed by the Company.

A. Definition and Requirements (Cont'd)

7. A charge may be assessed, at the discretion of the Company, to PSP subscribers who terminate or violate the requirements outlined in this section prior to the expiration of the term commitment.
 - a. The amount to be assessed for a Letter of Intent for the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan executed on or before February 24, 2003 will be as follows:
 - (1) If the termination or violation occurs within the first 12 months of a new agreement or contract extension, 50 percent of the monthly access line rate multiplied by the number of months remaining in the term agreement, then multiplied by the number of lines subscribed to the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan on the termination date of the agreement;
 - (2) If the termination or violation occurs within the second 12 month of a 24 month agreement or contract extension, 25 percent of the monthly access line rate multiplied by the number of months remaining in the term agreement, then multiplied by the number of lines subscribed to the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan on the termination date of the agreement.
 - b. For Subscriber's under a BellSouth PSP Reward Plan Letter of Intent dated after February 24, 2003, if the Subscriber terminates or becomes ineligible for the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan prior to the expiration of the term commitment, the Subscriber may be billed an amount equal to the total amount of rewards previously received by the Subscriber under the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan.
8. The rates listed in A7.4.5.A.1.a. for Access Line Service are stabilized under the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan for the term of the agreement and these lines will be exempt from Company initiated increases. Decreases in the Access Line charges that are initiated by the Company will be passed along to the subscriber, however:
 - a. The Company reserves the right to restructure the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan structure upon mandated rate reductions from the FCC to include rate rebalancing efforts. (T)

Any revisions to the BellSouth PSP Reward Plan will be made such that the subscribers will be charged a rate not to exceed the mandated rate and not to exceed the previous Reward Plan contracted rate.

A9.1 Foreign Exchange Service

A9.1.1 *Terms and Conditions*

- A. Foreign Exchange Service is exchange service furnished to a subscriber from an exchange other than the one from which he would normally be served.
- B. Foreign Exchange Service is offered in connection with Flat Rate or Measured Individual Line Main Station Service and Flat or Measured Rate PBX Service only. These channels may be furnished on a link (partial channel) basis when connected to FlexServ service, MegaLink Channel Service and/or LightGate service.
- C. Other services, equipment or facilities used in connection with Foreign Exchange Service, except as otherwise indicated in this *Guidebook*, are furnished subject to the rates, *terms and conditions* applying in the foreign exchange from which the subscriber is served. (T)
- D. Foreign Exchange Service is furnished subject to the same restrictions as to the use of the service by other than the subscriber and his representatives, as apply in connection with other classes of service.
- E. Subscribers to Foreign Exchange Service are not required to subscribe to other service in the exchange from which they would normally be served.
- F. Where the serving foreign exchange is a multioffice exchange, Foreign Exchange Service will be provided from whichever central office would be most economical to the Company; if an applicant desires operation from a different central office and facilities are available therefore, foreign central office mileage charges will apply for the channel required between the Company-selected central office and the central office from which the applicant desires to be served.
- G. Allowance For Interruptions
 - 1. Foreign Central Office Service

No allowance is made for interruptions of less than twenty-four hours. For interruptions of twenty-four hours or more, credit is allowed for the proportionate part of the monthly charge in multiples of one day for each twenty-four hours or major fraction thereof, of interruption for the portion of the facilities rendered inoperative by reason of the interruption.
 - 2. Foreign Exchange Service
 - a. No credit is allowed for interruptions to service of less than thirty minutes. Interruptions of thirty minutes or over are credited to the customer at the proportionate monthly contract charge in half-hour multiples for each half hour or major fraction thereof of interruption.
 - b. Message Toll Telephone Service furnished at a customer's request when his Foreign Exchange Service is interrupted, is charged for at message toll telephone rates.

A9.2 Foreign Central Office Service

A9.2.1 General

- A. Foreign Central Office Service is exchange service furnished to a subscriber in a multioffice exchange from a central office other than the one from which service would normally be furnished.
- B. Foreign Central Office Service is offered in connection with Individual Line Main Station Service, PBX Service and Centrex Type Services only.
- C. Other services, equipment or facilities used in connection with Foreign Central Office Service, except as otherwise indicated in this *Guidebook*, are furnished subject to the rates, *terms and conditions* applying in the foreign central office from which the subscriber is served. (T)
- D. Alternate routing of this service may be provided on a direct serve basis to the subscriber's premises from the requested foreign central office on an individual case basis as specified in Section A5., subject to the following conditions: (T)
 - 1. The subscriber must maintain a minimum of fifty percent of the trunks/lines from the central office from which service would normally be furnished.
 - 2. Rates and charges for all components of the service will continue to apply as specified in A9.2.2.A. and B. following, except that rates for Type 2145 channels do not apply. The monthly rate for the class of service desired will be that applicable from the foreign central office, however, the rate will be no less than that applicable had the service been provided from the normal serving wire center. Additionally, rates and charges as specified in Section A5. for the construction of facilities from the foreign central office to the subscriber's premises will apply.

A9.2.2 Rates And Charges

A. Methods Of Applying Rates

The rate for Foreign Central Office Service is the monthly rate for the class of service desired, plus a foreign central office mileage charge as shown in A9.2.2.B. following, for the distance, airline measurement, between the central office from which the subscriber would normally be served and the foreign central office, i.e., the central office from which the subscriber desires to be served. In addition, the subscriber is charged any zone charges which would apply for connection with the central office from which service normally would be rendered.

A14.3 Break In Rotary Number Group

A14.3.1 General

Break In Rotary Number Group is an arrangement whereby certain Central Office lines or PBX trunks may be temporarily removed from the Rotary Number Group by means of customer-provided equipment at the subscriber's premises which, through the use of a signaling channel, operates control equipment in the Central Office.

A14.3.2 Rates

The following rates apply for furnishing a break in a Rotary Number Group. The Basic Termination Charge applies to 60 months.

A14.15 Line Out-Of-Service Feature

A14.15.1 General

- A. Out-Of-Service Feature is designed to provide control of a single telephone line in a hunting group. By means of customer-provided equipment at the subscriber's premises, which is used to activate a control channel, the line made busy is bypassed until returned to normal by the customer. Where more than one line is to be taken out of service and repeated attempts could overload telephone switching equipment, a voice recorded announcement should be provided.
- B. At the customer's option, the Line Out-Of-Service Feature may be provided by one of the following.
 - 1. Answer-Only Arrangement
 The telephone line to be made busy is modified for answer-only service. By presenting an off-hook condition the line is busy.
 Auxiliary line service described in A3.17. preceding provides the necessary control features for this arrangement at no additional charge.
 - 2. Third Wire Control Arrangement
 The telephone line made to appear busy is arranged as (normal) two-way service. A control signal from the station is transmitted over a signaling channel to equipment in the central office which makes the line appear busy.
 In addition to the control equipment, a signaling channel is required.
