Descriptive Narrative:	BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Alabama intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DA) 510101 in the Azalea wire center (MOBLALAZ) in Mobile, AL due to the impact of the City of Mobile planned road construction project. The City of Mobile Innovating project 2018-3005-19 will repair, replace and/or rehabilitate existing infrastructure of new sidewalks, curb, and gutter. The county has requested AT&T Alabama to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before August 28, 2025.  Further, BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Alabama intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DAs) 3106, 3148 and 3150 in the Riverchase wire center (BRHMALRC) in Pelham, AL due to the impact of the City of Pelham planned road construction project. The county has requested AT&T Alabama to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before July 30, 2025.  BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Alabama intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DA) 3448 in the Bessemer Wire Center (BSMRALMA) in Bessemer, AL due to 740 feet of aerial copper cable theft. On numerous occasions, thieves have stolen copper cable serving this DA, including their replacement cables  In addition, BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Alabama intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DAs) 2109, 3123, 3130 and 3140 in the Bucksville Wire Center (BSMRALBU) in Bucksville, AL due to a planned Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) road move along Old Tuscaloosa hwy. The city has requested that AT&T Alabama remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before December 20, 2025.  AT&T Alabama plans to migrate customers currently served by copper facilities to existing Gigabit Passive Optical Network/Fiber-to-the-Premises (GPON/FTTP) facilities and then retire the copper facilities.
