

3. INTRALATA WHOLESAL SERVICE

3.1 Description

This guidebook contains regulations and rates applicable to IntraLATA Wholesale Service (IWS). IWS offers Interexchange Carriers (ICs) the ability to provide Presubscribable IntraLATA Calls for their end users over the Company's network from the Company's access lines provided to Company's end users. Customers with a valid Carrier Identification Code (CIC) and that are certified by the Illinois Commerce Commission are eligible to purchase IWS from this guidebook.

The Company provides ICs with an unrated message record of the Presubscribable IntraLATA Calls IC end-users place over the Company's network.

3.2 Definitions

Customer(s)

Denotes any individual, partnership, association, joint-stock company, Trust, corporation or government entity or any other entity which subscribes to the services offered under this guidebook.

End-User

Denotes any customer of an intrastate telecommunications service that is not a carrier.

Exchange

Denotes a unit, generally smaller than a LATA, established by the Company for the administration of communications service in a specified area which usually embraces a city, town or village and its environs. It consists of one or more central offices together with the associated facilities used in furnishing communications service within that area. One or more designated exchanges comprise a given LATA.

IntraLATA Service

Applies to service between points which are in the same Local Access and Transport Area (LATA).

Interexchange Carrier (IC)

Denotes any individual, partnership, association, joint-stock company, trust, governmental entity or corporation engaged for hire in intrastate, interstate or foreign communication by wire or radio, between two or more exchanges.

Local Access and Transport Area (LATA)

Denotes a geographic area established for the provision and administration of communications service. It encompasses one or more designated exchanges, which are grouped to serve common social, economic and other purposes. Equivalent to Market Service Area, as defined in the AT&T Illinois Guidebook, Part 2, Section 1.

Presubscribable IntraLATA Calls

Denotes calls that are subject to IntraMSA Presubscription, which generally includes most usage Band C and Message Toll Service calls. The specific regulations, descriptions, and definitions governing IntraMSA Presubscription are set forth in ILL C.C. NO. 21, Section 20, Subsection 4.

The Telephone Company

Refers to AT&T Illinois.

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3.3 Terms and Conditions

2.3.1 General

- (A) IWS offers ICs the ability transport Presubscribable IntraLATA Calls placed by the IC's end-users over the Company's network from the Company's access lines provided to the Company's end users. The network announcement heard by an end-user will be that of the Company, not the IWS customer, as the IC uses the Company's infrastructure including the network announcement.
- (B) IWS allows customers with a valid Carrier Identification Code (CIC) to route their presubscribable IntraLATA direct-dialed, 0+ IntraLATA Collect and 0+ Billed to Third Party IntraLATA calls over the Company's existing Network.
- (C) 0+ Collect intraLATA calls and 0+ Billed to Third Party intraLATA calls will route over the Company's network and be completed by the Company. The IWS customer will not be charged the MOU for these calls as set forth in 3.5. *Prices* following. The applicable rates for these calls are established by the Company, and the revenue for these calls will journal to the Company. The responsibility for notifying the IC's end-users about this billing arrangement rests with the IWS customer.
- (D) Excluded from IWS Service and IWS routing over the Company's network are: casual dialed IntraLATA toll calls (101XXXX+1), Foreign and Home Numbering Plan Area (F/HNPA) 555-1212 intraLATA, HNPA 555-1212 interLATA and Sent-Paid Coin service. The customer must make other routing arrangements for the transport of these types of calls. Sent-Paid Coin Service will not work without Exchange Access Operator Services Signaling and coin control signaling provided by the customer's designated trunk group.
- (E) The Company will resolve trouble isolated to the Company's network as reported by the IWS customer, as well as the IWS customer's end users. Such trouble may be reported to Company's repair bureau by the IWS customer or the IWS customer's end users.

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3.3 Terms and Conditions (cont'd)

3.3.2 Ordering

- (A) An IWS Order is an order to provide the IC with IWS services or provide modifications to existing IWS services. IWS is ordered at the state level by submitting the "IWS Ordering Form" to the Access Service Center. The customer must purchase IWS for all Tandems that serve a Company End Office within a state, as listed on the IWS Ordering Form, when ordering service. The IWS Service order charge as specified in 3.5. *Prices* following will apply to each Tandem.
- (B) A minimum of 30 days written notice to establish service or to disconnect service is required.

3.3.3 Regulations in the AT&T Illinois Guidebook, Part 2, Section 2, apply. For the purposes of those regulations, the following definitions apply.

- (A) The term "service" or "Carrier Class of Service" as used in these regulations shall mean "the Company's provision of IWS as defined in this section.
- (B) The term "Carrier" as used in these regulations shall mean the IC that is the IWS customer as defined in this section.
- (C) The term "Company" as used in these regulations shall mean the Company as defined in this section.

3.4 Rate Application

This section contains the specific regulations governing the rates and charges that apply for IWS.

There are three types of rates and charges that may apply to the IWS rate elements. These are monthly recurring rates, usage rates and nonrecurring charges.

Monthly Rates

Monthly rates are flat recurring rates that apply each month or fraction thereof that a specific rate element is provided. For billing purposes, each month is considered to have 30 days. Currently there are no monthly rates applicable to IWS.

Usage Rates

Usage rates are rates that apply only when a specific rate element is used. These are applied on a per occurrence basis. Usage rates are accumulated over a monthly period.

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3.4 Rate Application (cont'd)

Nonrecurring Charges

Nonrecurring charges are one-time charges that apply for a specific work activity.

IWS Rates and Charges are shown in 3.5. *Prices* following. Applicable rate applications for all rate elements are as follows:

IWS Rate

The IWS Rate is a usage rate applied to each completed originating conversation minute of use. It includes the use of network facilities, intraLATA toll terminating charges, and Company delivery of unrated toll records to the IC.

IWS Service Order Charge

The IWS Service Order Charge is a nonrecurring charge and will be applied to each service order, per Tandem, processed by the Company. All Tandems that serve a Company End Office in the state of Illinois are required to be provisioned with IWS service, as described in 3.3. *Terms and Conditions* preceding.

IWS Network Charge

The IWS Network Charge is a nonrecurring charge and will be applied to any initial IWS order. This charge covers the establishment and removal of IWS functionality in all Company end offices for which service is ordered.
