Re: Grandfather Analog Video Service

Pursuant to General Order 96-B, AT&T California (U-1001-C) submits this Advice Letter to make changes to its intrastate Access Service Tariff Schedule Cal. P.U.C. No.175-T, Sections 7 and 16. The purpose of this filing is to Grandfather Analog Video Service effective December 31, 2020, and note the intended withdrawal of the service on or after December 31, 2021.

Analog Video Service is at the end of its product life with only 9 subscribers to the service as of June 2020. Analog Video Service provides one-way transmission of video signals between two customer-designated premises. Analog Video Service Technology is outdated, and replacement parts/equipment are no longer supported. AT&T is providing customers with notice of its intended withdrawal of service one year in advance to allow customers a smooth transition to a digital technology.

Customer notice has been sent to affected customers as required by D.07-09-019. A copy of the customer notice is included.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.

This advice letter is submitted as a Tier I filing in accordance with General Order 96-B. AT&T California requests that this advice letter become effective the same day as the submission date, December 31, 2020.

7.2.5 Video Service

(A) Basic Channel Description

A Video channel is a channel with one-way transmission capability for a standard 525 line/60 field monochrome, or National Television Systems Committee color, video signal and one or more associated audio signal(s) as described below.

The provision and the bandwidth of the associated audio signal(s) is a function of the channel interface selected by the customer. Video channels are provided between customer designated premises, between a customer designated premises and a Utility Hub, between an EIS Point of Termination and a customer premises, or between a Utility Hub and an EIS Point of Termination.

(1) Analog Video Service\*

Analog Video Service provides one-way transmission of video signals between two customer-designated premises or between a customer-designated premises and a Utility Hub, where available, using fiber optic facilities. An NTSC video channel provides a standard 525 line/60 field monochrome, or NTSC color video signal, with up to four (4) associated 20 kHz audio signals. The bandwidth for Analog Video Service is 30 Hz to 6.6 MHz.

Analog Video Service is provided where facilities are available. Where facilities are not available, Special Construction may apply.

(D) Optional Features and Functions (Cont'd)

- (3) Service Through-Connect - Analog Video Service\* and Serial Component Video Service (C)

The Service Through-Connect allows for the interconnection of parts of a like service with like jurisdiction to form a complete two-point service at a Utility-designated Video Hub where two (2) different customers pay for their part of the service.

The ability to transport DVB-ASI is available on a point to point basis, or through a designated Video Service Hub where available.

Each customer will be responsible for ordering and paying for that part of the Video Service that begins at the point of termination at the customer's premises and ends at the Service Through-Connect. Additionally, the customer ordering the Service Through-Connect is responsible for paying for this feature and any other charges associated with the interconnection.

The customer ordering the Service Through-Connect must provide to the Utility any and all appropriate channel information and written letter of agency obtained from the other customer who is being interconnected.

Disconnecting any part of the service shall be deemed a disconnection of the entire service and termination charges shall apply, where applicable.

The customer that controls the Service Through-Connect shall be the primary customer of the service, including, but not limited to activities such as ordering service changes and reporting service outages.

16.6.5 SONET Connection to Special Access

EIS SONET Service will be connected from the EIS Point of Termination to SONET Ring and Access Services\* and will be subject to all appropriate nonrecurring charges, monthly rates, and other applicable rates and charges as described in Section 7 preceding. The EIS SONET connection must meet the technical parameters of the SONET Service to which it is connecting.

16.6.6 Analog Video Connection to Special Access

EIS Analog Video will connect to a hubbed Analog Video Special Access Service\*\* which will be subject to all applicable nonrecurring charges, monthly rates, and other applicable rates and charges as described in Sections 7. and 13. preceding. The EIS Analog Video Connection must meet the technical parameters for the Special Access Analog Video Service to which it is connecting.

16.6.6 Analog Video Connection to Special Access (Cont'd)

There will be three (3) EIS Analog Video Connections:

(L)

- A Non Hub-Video/Audio EISCC will be used when the collocator's cage to which the EIS Analog Video Connection terminates is not in the same central office as the Analog Video Hub to which the service connects.
- A Hub-Combined Video and Audio EISCC will be used when the collocator's cage to which the EIS Analog Video Connection terminates is in the same central office as the Analog Video Hub to which the service connects, and the customer delivers, at the EIS POT, a combined hand-off of a video signal and its associated audio channels.
- A Hub-Video plus Audio EISCC will be used when the collocator's cage to which the EIS Analog Video Connection terminates is in the same central office as the Analog Video Hub to which the service connects, and the customer delivers, at the EIS POT, separate hand-offs of a video signal and its associated audio channels.
