2. Definition of Terms (Cont'd)

High Speed Digital ALI (Automatic Location Identification) Retrieval Feature: High Speed Digital ALI Retrieval is a feature of the Utility's ALI Database, and therefore, provided when the customer orders or subscribes to the ALI database service. This feature provides for the routing of ANI (Automatic Number Identification) from specific Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) to the Utility's ALI Database to obtain the appropriate caller location information. The Utility will provide the necessary Network Terminating Equipment (NTE), to be placed at the customer's premises as part of the High Speed Digital ALI Feature. The Utility's NTE, is installed by the Utility on the customer's premise and shall remain the property of the Utility.<sup>1</sup>

Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP): An answering location for 9-1-1 calls originating in a given area. A PSAP may be designated as Primary or Secondary, which refers to the order in which calls are directed for answering. Primary PSAPs answer all calls first; Secondary PSAPs receive calls on a transfer basis only.

Selective Routing (SR): A feature that routes an E9-1-1 call from an E9-1-1 Control Office to the designated primary PSAP based upon the identified number of the calling party.

Serving Central Office: The local Central Office from which a PSAP, either Primary or Secondary, is served.
