Re: Resolution M-4874. Adopts level of Public Utilities Commission
Utilities Reimbursement Account User Fees, effective January 1, 2025

Pursuant to General Order 96-B and Resolution M-4866, adopted December 19, 2024 and effective January 1, 2025, AT&T California submits this advice letter to revise Schedule Cal. P.U.C. No. A2. General Regulations, 2.1 Rules, 2.1.37 Rule No. 37 - Surcharge to Fund California Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee, to change the fee level from 1.2% to 1.1%. Due to an oversight, this tariff revision was not filed effective January 1, 2025. Affected customers will be credited for any overcharges resulting from the previous fee level being applied beyond the January 1, 2025 effective date.

This filing will not cause a rate increase, the withdrawal of service or conflict with other schedules or rules.

This advice letter is submitted as a Tier I filing in accordance with General Order 96-B. AT&T California requests that this advice letter become effective on May 14, 2025.

2.1.37 RULE NO. 37 - SURCHARGE TO FUND CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION REIMBURSEMENT FEE

APPLICABILITY

This surcharge is for the purpose of funding the California Public Utilities Commission and applies to the aggregate amount of customer billings associated with intrastate billings which appear on customers' bills.

TERRITORY

Within the exchange areas of all exchanges as these areas are defined on maps filed as part of the tariff schedules.

RATES

SURCHARGE¹

As authorized by Public Utilities Code Section 404(c) and Resolution M-4874, a 1.1% surcharge shall be applied to all intrastate customer billings (excluding yellow page directory revenues and direct sales and its associated provisions as they appear on the customer's bill, incarcerated individuals and Universal Lifeline Telephone Service) for the Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee. The surcharge will be applied to the customer's bill for intrastate services for all such services that appear on that particular bill, exclusive of federal and local excise taxes². (C)

The Utility shall not be liable for any and all penalties, losses or damages sustained by any carrier, or its customers, as a result of its use and concurrence of the Commission Reimbursement Fee rate contained in the Utility's tariffs under Resolution T-16901. (C)

NOTE 1: In 1983 the Legislature established the Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee to be paid by Utilities to fund their regulation by the Commission (Public Utilities (PU) Code Section 401-443). The fee assessed on telephone corporations is ordered by the Commission under authority granted by PU Code Section 433. On December 19, 2024, Resolution M-4874 decreased the fee from 1.2% to 1.1%, effective January 1, 2025. (C)

NOTE 2: In accordance with Resolution T-17321 and Decision 10-11-033, effective December 1, 2011, this surcharge is no longer applied to customer billings for services provided under the California LifeLine program. (C)

SURCHARGE¹ (Cont'd)

THE UTILITY SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY AND ALL CLAIMS ARISING OUT OF ANY ACT OR OMISSION BY THE UTILITY AS A RESULT OF A CARRIER'S USE AND CONCURRENCE OF THE COMMISSION REIMBURSEMENT FEE RATE CONTAINED IN THE UTILITY'S TARIFFS UNDER RESOLUTION T-16901.

The Utility shall be indemnified, defended and held harmless by all carriers against any claims, loss or damage arising from a carrier's use and concurrence in the Commission Reimbursement Fee rate contained in the Utility's tariffs under Resolution T-16901.
