2.7 Definitions (Cont'd)

Partitioned Space

Denotes an area designated by the Telephone Company within a wire center to be used by an Interconnector for the sole purpose of installing, maintaining and operating its transmission equipment to connect the Interconnector's services to Telephone Company-provided services. Partitioned space is not considered to be a premises, as defined in 2.7 following, for the purposes of administering regulations and rates contained in this tariff.

Pay Telephone

Denotes Telephone Company-provided instruments and related facilities that are available to the general public for public convenience and necessity, including public, semipublic and coinless telephones.

Personal Communications Service (PCS)

Denotes a set of capabilities that allows some combination of personal mobility, terminal mobility and service profile management.



Phase Jitter

Denotes the unwanted phase variations of a signal.

Point of Termination

See Demarcation Point.

Premises

Denotes a building, or a portion of a building in a multitenant building, or buildings on continuous property (except Railroad Right-of-way, etc.) not separated by a public highway.

Pricing Zone

Denotes a unit within a LATA or exchange established by the Telephone Company for rating certain Switched Transport Services, High Capacity Special Access Service and MegaLink Custom Service. Pricing zones are divided into three (3) categories: (1) high density, (2) medium density, and (3) low density categories.

Miscellaneous Services Descriptions (Cont'd)

6.4.3 900 Access Service

(A) General

900 Access Service is an originating offering utilizing trunk side Switched Access Services. 900 Access Service allows the customer's end user to originate 900 calls on a one-plus (1+) basis without the use of an access code.

When a customer's end user originates a 1+900+NXX-XXXX or 0+900+NXX-XXXX call, the Telephone Company will perform the customer identification function at a 900 Access Service screening office to determine the customer to which the call is to be routed. The customer identification function will consist of the 900 Access Service screening office examining the 900-NXX digits to determine which customer should receive the call. If a 900 Access Service call originates at an office not equipped to provide the customer identification function, the call will be routed to a tandem at which the function is available.

The following 1+900 Access Service calls will be blocked by the Telephone Company:

- calls dialed with a 101XXXX access code,
- calls originated from coin telephones, and
- calls originated from hotels and motels without call rating systems.

The following 0+900 Access Service calls will be blocked by the Telephone Company:

- calls dialed with a 101XXXX access code,
- calls from Inmate Service, and
- calls originated to a customer that has not subscribed (D) to 0+900 Access Service.

13.3 Miscellaneous Services (Cont'd)

13.3.12 Selective Class of Call Screening (SCOCS)

An optional service available, where facilities permit, in Telephone Company electronic end offices. This service restricts outgoing 1+, 0+ and 0- calls placed over the Telephone Company's network, to only those calls which are charged to a number other than the originating number, i.e., collect or third number billed. Selective Class of Call (D) Screening is available for use with line side General Exchange Tariff services that are provided for the provision of telecommunication services to transient members of the public.

Selective Class of Call Screening is offered in three basic types. The applicable recurring rate and nonrecurring charge will depend upon the type selected. These rates and charges can be found in Section 13.4.15.

Type I, Basic SCOCS

An outgoing 1+ call will not be permitted unless the end user makes arrangements to have the call billed to a called telephone number (Collect) or a third number. (D)

(2) Type II, Collect Only-Inmate Calls

Only an outgoing call billed to a called number (Collect) is permitted.

(3) Type III, Coinless Only SCOCS

An outgoing call will not be permitted unless the end user makes arrangements to have the call billed to a called telephone number (Collect) or a third number.

24.2 LIDB Service Applications

There are three different LIDB Service Applications:

- Validation Service
- OLNS Service
- Preferred Validation Service

Following are detailed descriptions of each of the available service applications.

24.2.1 Validation Service

Validation Service provides access to billing validation data residing in the Telephone Company's LIDB. Validation Service is provided by the Telephone Company to its customers in support of Alternate Billing Services such as Collect Calls and Third Number Billing. Alternate Billing (D) Services allow customers' end users the ability to bill calls to an account not necessarily associated with the originating line.

Validation Service provides customers with potential toll fraud detection by validating toll billing exception data (D) and performing public telephone checks. Validation Service will provide the following functions on a per query basis:

- (D)
- Determination of whether the billed line has decided in advance to reject certain calls billed as collect or to a third number.
- Determination of billed line as a public (including those classified as semi public) or nonworking telephone number

Validation Service can be used on a call-by-call basis or for limited purpose of validating billing information by a Billing Clearing House.

 - 24.3.4 Provision Against Fraudulent Use of Service
 - (A) The Telephone Company has procedures in place to deactivate LIDB Service Application data in the event that it is being used fraudulently.

(B) End user information, pertinent to a Telephone Company investigation, may be shared with customers when validation queries for the specific customer reaches the Telephone Company established fraud threshold level. This fraud threshold level will be applied uniformly to all customers.

24.4 Rate Regulations (Cont'd)

24.4.1 Rate Elements

The following provides a list of the various LIDB Service rate elements and how the rate elements are defined.

- LIDB Query Transport (described in (A) following)
- Validation Service Query (described in (B) following)
 OLNS Service Query (described in (C) following)

(A) LIDB Query Transport

The LIDB Query Transport rate element provides for the routing of the LIDB query through one of two Telephone Company interconnecting STPs, as designated by the Telephone Company, to the Telephone Company's LIDB, and back. The STPs locations are provided in the National Exchange Carriers Association, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No 4.

(B) Validation Service Query

The Validation Service Query rate element provides for the validation of toll billing exception data and performance of public telephone checks; i.e. determine if a billed line is a public (including (D) those classified as semi public) telephone number.

(C) OLNS Service Query

The OLNS Service Query rate element provides for identification of the originating screening requirements for call processing and billing that are associated with an originating line.

(B) Service Provisioning (Cont'd)

(2) Limitations

(a) Due to technical limitations, two-way port interfaces cannot subtend the following Telephone Company Access Tandems: DLLSTXTA03T

The TIPTOP Customer must select another tandem that meets the LATA Wide TIPTOP architecture requirement, as described herein.

- (b) TIPTOP service does not include Alternate Billed Services (ABS). ABS includes, but is not limited to, Collect Calling, Third Party Billed Calls, Phone Card calls, or Credit Card (D) calls billed to telephone numbers assigned to the IP-VIS User of the TIPTOP Customer or the TIPTOP Customer
- (c) Specific to traffic sent to a TIPTOP Customer over the TIPTOP port interface, TIPTOP service is not available where the Telephone Company is required to pay reciprocal compensation, access charges, meet point billing charges, transit charges, or any other fees.
- (d) TIPTOP Messaging Application may only be used in conjunction with SS7 signaling connections used for TIPTOP Services.

(3) Emergency 911 Service

Emergency 911 Service is not available with TIPToP Service purchased under this tariff.

(4) SPNP Service Charge

When the TIPToP Customer purchases a TIPToP One-Way Port Interface the Telephone Company will provide Service Provider Number Portability (SPNP) Query Service under the rates and terms as set forth in Section 6-11-3.

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
