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PURPOSE: Increase business Local Exchange Service monthly charges.

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A3. BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

A3.1 General

- A. Basic local exchange service, as offered in this Guidebook, is comprised of exchange access lines defined as follows:
 - Exchange Access Line The serving central office line equipment and all the Company plant facilities up to and including the Company-provided Standard Network Interface. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for message toll service and for local calling appropriate to the offering selected by the customer.
- **B.** Exchange access lines are subject to the nonrecurring charges specified in Section A4.
- C. Rates for basic local exchange service are applied on the basis of statewide groupings according to the total number of exchange access lines, PBX trunks and network access registers in the local calling area excluding the Extended Calling Service exchanges.
- **D.** Exchange Service Areas for each exchange are identified on maps.
- E. The rates for service and equipment not specifically shown in this section are presented in other sections of this Guidebook.
- **F.** Pursuant to passage of the Telecommunications Access System Act of 1991 by the Florida Legislature during the 1991 session, a monthly surcharge shall be imposed on all local exchange telecommunications company subscribers on an individual access line basis, except that such surcharge shall not be imposed upon more than 25 basic telecommunications access lines per account bill rendered. The Commission shall determine the amount of the surcharge; however, in no case shall the amount exceed 25 cents per line per month. The surcharge shall appear on the initial bill to the subscriber and itemized at least once annually.
- G. Residence Access Line Retention Offer

Existing residential customers who call to disconnect service with AT&T and elect to stay and have one (or up to a maximum of two) access line(s) may be eligible to receive a \$6 per month bill credit for 12 months. The following conditions apply:

- 1. Customers must keep the required services for 30 days to receive the benefit of this offer.
- 2. Customers subscribing to Complete Choice Enhanced or Complete Choice Basic must have the access line in service for a minimum of 60 days before the customer becomes eligible for this offer.
- 3. If the customer disconnects the line(s) or moves from their current location, the remaining benefits will cease.
- 4. AT&T employees are not eligible for this offer.
- 5. Customer must be calling into AT&T to disconnect their local service.
- 6. This offer is available on a maximum of two (2) lines (a maximum monthly reward of \$12).
- 7. Not stackable with any other regulated retention offer that provides a monthly discount.
- 8. Eligible customers are existing AT&T residential customers who have a primary access line, or a primary access line with an additional access line(s), and are calling to disconnect one or more access lines.
- 9. This offer is only available for retention purposes.
- 10. The monthly bill credit stays in effect as long as the customer remains at the same address and is limited to a maximum of 12 months.
- 11. Eligible customers may only receive this offer once during the offer benefit period.

3. Minimum Service Period

If Announcement Service is terminated by the initial subscriber within six months of the initial installation, the minimum network usage charge for the period served will be 75 percent of six months usage computed at the maximum level of monthly hours of use for which the network facilities are designed, as determined by the Company.

4. Minimum Monthly Charge

The minimum monthly charge shall be 75 percent of the monthly usage level which is forecasted by the customer and for which the network facilities are designed (e.g., a network designed for 2000 average hours of use per month would incur a minimum charge equivalent to the charge for 1500 hours of use).

5. Foreign Exchange or Foreign Central Office Service

Where service is requested from an exchange or central office foreign to that which would normally serve the announcement service, charges as specified in Section A9 or A13 will apply.

- E. Client's and Agency's Responsibilities (Cont'd)
 - 2. Alarm Agency
 - a. Nothing contained in this Guidebook shall be construed as establishing any agency agreement, partnership or joint venture between the Company and any alarm and security company or entity utilizing this service. Any such company or entity utilizing WatchAlert Service shall be responsible for obtaining all licenses, permits and authorizations as may be required by the appropriate federal, state or local governmental authorities and will comply with all codes, laws, terms, conditions, restrictions or limitations governing the use of equipment or services employed by the agency in providing service to its clients.
 - b. Agency requests to connect or disconnect WatchAlert Service must be provided to the Company in writing.
 - c. Client requests to connect or disconnect WatchAlert Service will be to the agency.
 - d. WatchAlert requires the agency to subscribe to two Type 2141 channel services (one for each WSP) between its premises and its serving central office at standard rates and charges as contained in Section B3 of the Private Line Guidebook.
 - e. The agency will be responsible for notifying its clients of any billing changes as described in paragraph D.
 - f. WatchAlert Service will be utilized solely for the transmission of alarm/security signal status. Transmission of other signals or data is prohibited.
- F. Reporting Procedures
 - 1. The agency will, upon receipt of an alarm/security report, contact the client or the client's designated initial point of contact of a potential security problem. The agency will, under no circumstances, have the Company make the first dispatch in response to an alarm/security report at a client's premises. Company dispatch for repair will not be made until verification that the condition is not due to a security problem (burglary, fire). The agency or client must provide safe, personal access for repair service. In the event of an open customer line, the designated Company Repair Service will be the second point of contact.
 - Repair and maintenance of customer premises equipment is not the Company's responsibility. Upon verification by the agency that the terminal equipment is not at fault, the client or agency will report the problem to the designated Company Repair Service. If it is subsequently discovered that the terminal equipment is at fault, the client will be billed the appropriate Dispatch Charge Trouble Determination (TLCPR) specified for Basic Residence and Basic Business services.
