	BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Florida intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DA) 110552 in the Red Road wire center (MIAMFLRR) in Coral Cables and Miami, FL due to the impact of a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) planned road construction project. This project will develop a new public city park, including sidewalks and curb ramps. FDOT has requested AT&T Florida to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before August 30, 2025.
	In addition, BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Florida intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DA) 120535 in the Hollywood Main wire center (HLWDFLMA) in Hollywood, FL due to the impact of a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) planned road construction project. This project will install new bike lanes, sidewalk, and upgrade curb ramps to comply with the Americans Disabilities Act (ADA). FDOT has also requested AT&T Florida to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before August 30, 2025.
	Further, BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Florida intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DAs) 111021, 111022 and 2153B in the Weeki Weechee Spring Main wire center (WWSPFLHI) in Weeki Weechee, FL due to the impact of a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) planned road construction project. This FDOT FPID project will develop a new traffic signal, resurfacing of the roadway, sidewalk and pedestrian features. FDOT has requested AT&T Florida to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before December 31, 2025.
	AT&T Florida plans to migrate customers currently served by copper facilities to existing Gigabit Passive Optical Network/Fiber-to-the-Premises (GPON/FTTP) facilities and then retire the copper facilities.
