FDOT has requested AT&T Florida to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before August 28, 2025.</p> <p>Further, BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Florida intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DAs) 410502, 721204, 7212A, 7212B, 7212C, 7215B, 7215C, 7324C, 7324E, 7418C, 7418G, 742603, 7434B and 7504B in the Stuart wire center (STRFLMA) in Stuart, FL due to the impact of a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) planned road construction project. FDOT has requested AT&T Florida to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before December 31, 2025.</p> <p>BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Florida also intends to retire copper facilities serving distribution area (DAs) 116902, 119102, 119202, 119302, 119402, 119502, 119602, 119702 and 119802 in the Royal Palm wire center (WPBHFLRP) in West Palm Beach, FL due to the impact of a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) planned road construction project. FDOT has requested AT&T Florida to remove or relocate its facilities in the way of this project before August 30, 2025.</p> <p>AT&T Florida plans to migrate customers currently served in these areas by copper facilities to existing Gigabit Passive Optical Network/Fiber-to-the-Premises (GPON/FTTP) facilities and then retire the copper facilities.</p> |
