10. Federal Government Specialized Service or Arrangements

10.1 General

This section covers Specialized Service or Arrangements that are provided to a customer for use only by agencies or branches of the Federal Government and other users authorized by the Federal Government. In addition, this section covers TSP procedures as set forth in this section and as administrated by the Federal Government. Services provided to state emergency operations centers are included. These services provide for command and control communications, including communications for national security, emergency preparedness and presidential requirements. They are required to assure continuity of Government in emergency and crisis situations and to provide for national security.

Services for command and control communications and for national security and emergency preparedness sometimes require short notice and short duration service provisions. These provisions are especially needed to meet presidential requirements or in response to natural, man-made, or declared emergencies. Requirements of this type cannot be forecasted and are usually needed for a relatively short period. The provision of service under these conditions may require the availability of facilities, such as portable microwave equipment, which are provided on a temporary basis by the Telephone Company or customer.

10.2 Emergency Conditions

These services will be provided on the date requested or as soon as possible thereafter when the emergency falls into one of the following categories:

- State of crisis declared by the National Command Authorities (includes commitments made to the Office of Emergency Communications in the "National Plan for Emergencies and Major Disasters").
- Efforts to protect endangered U.S. personnel or property both in the U.S. and abroad. (Includes space vehicle recovery and protection efforts.)
- Communications requirements resulting from hostile action, a major disaster or a major civil disturbance.
- The director (Cabinet level) of a Federal department, Commander of a Unified/Specified Command, or head of a military department has certified that a communications requirement is so critical to the protection of life and property or to the National Defense that it must be processed immediately.

10. Federal Government Specialized Service or Arrangements (Cont'd)

10.2 Emergency Conditions (Cont'd)

- Political unrest in foreign countries which affect the national interest.
- Presidential service.

10.3 Intervals to Provide Service

Certain services provided under the provisions of this section of the tariff are provided on an individual case basis. Therefore, orders for such service shall be placed under the Negotiated Interval provisions set forth in 5.2.1(B) preceding.

10.4 Safeguarding of Service

10.4.1 Facility Availability

In order to insure communications during periods of emergency, the Telephone Company will, within the limits of good management, make available the necessary facilities to restore service in the event of damage or to provide temporary emergency service, as set forth in Sections 10.6.1(D) and 10.6.3(E), following In order to meet the requirements of agencies or branches of the Federal Government, the Telephone Company may utilize government-owned facilities, when necessary to provide service.

10.5 Federal Government Regulations

In accordance with Federal Government Regulations, all service provided to the Federal Government will be billed in arrears. However, this provision does not apply to other customers that obtain services under the provisions of this tariff to provide their services to the Federal Government.

10.6 Service Offerings

The following unique services are provided to a customer for use only by agencies or branches of the Federal Government, other authorized users and state emergency operations centers. The rates and charges for certain services shall be developed on an individual case basis and shall be consistent with the rates and charges for services offered in other sections of this tariff.

Additional conditioning (available in one or two directions on four-wire facilities only) to provide the following characteristics:

The absolute loss (referenced to one milliwatt) with respect to frequency shall not exceed:

0 dB at 1,000 Hz + 1dB between 1,000 Hz and 40,000 Hz + 2dB between 10 Hz and 50,000 Hz (+ means more loss)

The net loss of the conditioned service (with or without additional conditioning) shall not vary by more than four dB at 1,000 Hz from the levels specified above. Voice frequency signaling or supervisory tones can be transmitted.

(2) Voice Grade Secure Communications Type II

Approximate bandwidth 10-50,000 Hz. Furnished on four-wire metallic facilities for duplex operation for two-point secure communications between an IC premises on an end user's premises and an end user's premises. Services are conditioned as follows:

Approximate bandwidth 10-50,000 Hz. Furnished on four-wire metallic facilities for duplex operation for two-point secure communications between an IC premises switch and an end user's premises. Services are conditioned as follows:

G-2 Conditioning - The absolute loss with respect to frequency and the net loss variation from the switch to an end user's premises shall be the same as Voice Grade Secure Communications Type I services without additional conditioning; from an end user's premises to the switch shall be the same as Voice Grade Secure Communications Type I services with additional conditioning. Voice frequency signaling or supervisory tones can be transmitted.

(4) Voice Grade Secure Communications Type IV

Approximate bandwidth 10-50,000 Hz. Furnished on four-wire metallic facilities for duplex operation for two-point secure communication between two IC premises switches. Services are conditioned as follows:

G-3 Conditioning - The absolute loss with respect to frequency and the net loss variation shall be the same in both directions of transmission as Voice Grade Secure Communications Type I services with additional conditioning. Voice frequency signaling or supervisory tones can be transmitted.

(C) Special Routing Access Service

Special Routing Access Service is furnished only to AT&T Communications (AT&T-C) for an agency or branch of the Federal Government. This service provides the customer's end users the ability to originate and terminate calls to or from the customer's premises utilizing a Special Routing Plan. This service is an optional service which operates in conjunction with Trunk Side Premium Access Service furnished to AT&T-C under other provisions of this tariff.

The Telephone Company will record Special Routing Access Service Active Mode Trunk Usage, and will bill the customer in accordance with these records. The hours for each trunk ordered will be summed and then rounded to the nearest hour, except that when the total is less than one hour, one hour will be used to determine the charge. (D)

(D) Telecommunications Service Priority (TSP) System

(1) Priority installation and/or restoration of NSEP telecommunications services shall be provided in accordance with Part 64.401, Appendix A, of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) Rules and Regulations.

In addition, TSP System service shall be provided in accordance with the guidelines set forth in "Telecommunications Service Priority (TSP) System for National Security Emergency Preparedness (NSEP) Service Vendor Handbook" (OEC) Handbook 3-1-2 dated July 9, 1990, and "TSP System for National Security Emergency Preparedness (NSEP) Service User Manual (OEC) M 3-1-1.

The TSP System is a service, developed to meet the requirements of the Federal Government as detailed in Service Vendor's Handbook, and Service User Manual which provides the regulatory, administrative and operational framework for the priority installation and/or restoration of (NSEP) telecommunications services. These include both Switched and Special Access Services. The TSP System applies only to NSEP telecommunications services, and requires and authorizes priority action by the Telephone Company providing such services. TSP System applicability is limited to Access Services which the Telephone Company can discreetly identify for Priority Installation and/or Priority Restoration.

- (2) Some of the elements required for the TSP System are included in other sections of this tariff as general service offerings. They have been referenced in this section to reflect the complete TSP System with appropriate references to those other sections of the tariff for regulations, rates and charges.
- (3) The customer for TSP System Service also must be the same customer for t Access Service with which it is associated.

(D) Telecommunications Service Priority (TSP) System (Cont'd)

- (4) Under certain conditions it may be necessary to preempt one or more customer services with a lower or no restoration priority in order to install or restore NSEP telecommunications service(s) of a higher priority. If such preemption is necessary, and if circumstances permit, the Telephone Company will make reasonable effort to notify the preempted service customer of the action to be taken. Credit allowance for such service preemption shall be made in accordance with the provisions set forth in 2.4.4(E) preceding concerning Temporary Surrender of a service.
- (5) The customer, in obtaining TSP System service, acknowledges and consents to the provision of certain customer service record information by the Telephone Company to the Federal Government as denoted in The TSP Service Vendor Handbook in order for the Government to maintain and administer its overall TSP System. This customer service record information will include only TSP Authorization Code and Telephone Company Circuit/Service ID.
- (6) When Priority Restoration Maintenance and Administration, as defined in the TSP Service Vendor Handbook, is discontinued (Revocation of Assigned Restoration Priority), and the associated Access Service is continued in service, the charge specified in 10.6.3(E)(2)(c) will not apply for such a discontinuance.
- (7) Credit allowance for service interruption for Priority Restoration Maintenance and Administration shall be the same as for the Access Service with which it is associated as set forth in 2.4.4 preceding.
- (8) Certain activities performed by the Telephone Company associated with the TSP System, as specified in the Service Vendor Handbook, are included in the rate elements as follows:
 - (a) Priority Installation Invocation includes System Development, Verification Confirmation and Preemption.

In subscribing to Restoration Priority and/or Priority Installation service the customer recognizes this condition and grants the Telephone Company the right to quote charges after the restoration has been completed.

- (a) The Federal Government Term Discount Plan (FGTDP) will be provided to any customer awarded a contract to provide telecommunications services for the exclusive use of the Federal Government and its authorized agents. The FGTDP will allow each of the Federal Government's authorized contractors providing network services under contract to obtain discounted rates for specified services in return for certain term commitments.
- (b) In addition to the specific terms and conditions of this Plan described below, all other General Regulations for this Plan are contained in Sections 1, 2, and 5 preceding.
- (2) Service Component Limitation

This Plan is limited to Direct Analog, DS1 and DS3 service offerings as described in Section 7, preceding.

- (a) This plan will apply rate discounts, as specified in 10.6.1(E)(4) following, for Direct Analog, DS1 and DS3 Local Distribution Channels, Channel Mileage Terminations and Channel Mileage recurring rate elements from specific government locations (Service Delivery Points). Nonrecurring charges will apply for all installations, changes and additions/deletions of circuits and optional features and functions according to the rates in effect as specified in other sections of this tariff.
- (b) In the case where the government agency(s) at a current SDP chooses or is ordered to move to a new SDP, and the new SDP requires the same or more services provided under the plan, termination liabilities will not apply. 10.6.3 Rates and Charges

(A) Move Charges

- (1) When service without a maximum termination liability charge associated with it, as set forth in (A) and (B) preceding, is moved to a different building, the nonrecurring charge applies; when moved to a new location in the same building, a charge of one-half the nonrecurring charge applies.

Move charges include the estimated costs of removal, restoration of services or facilities necessitated by the move, transportation, storage, reinstallation, engineering, labor, supervision, materials, administration, and any other specific items of cost directly attributable to the move.

Calls will use the two Advanced Intelligent Network (AIN) features, Alternate Carrier Routing (ACR) and Calling Party Number. Rates and charges are shown in (¢) Section 10.7.1(F)(2) following. (N) (1) Alternate Carrier Routing (ACR) Feature The Alternate Carrier Routing (ACR) feature will provide the GETS caller dialing the 1+710-NCS-GETS access number routing to one of three predetermined Interexchange Carriers (IXCs) as determined by the governments agent. Calling Party Number (CPN) is a feature that when activated will allow the 710-NCS-GETS number to be displayed as the calling party. If this feature is not activated, then the calling party's local exchange number will be displayed. Access Code Activation and Call Routing Plan setup are the processes used to open and verify the 710 area code in all class 5 end offices, and implement the appropriate call routing plans. Specialized call data reports will contain call routing information. These reports will be available monthly upon request and may be used at the time of a national disaster. Operations, Maintenance, Usage Reports are the ongoing network functions that are provided monthly or quarterly with this service. (N)

GETS HPC changes the priority assigned to the call setup message for a 710-NCS-GETS in the Signaling System 7 (SS7) network. Setup messages associated with calls to 1-710-NCS-GETS will be sent with the highest priority. GETS HPC also provides a trunk queuing feature in equipped switches which is invoked any time an Interexchange Carrier (IC) trunk group is busy. The queuing is only applicable to GETS calls. Queuing allows callers to 710-NCS GETS users to dial an emergency call one time and not encounter a busy signal. The call will be placed in queue and automatically complete when the first available trunk becomes idle.

(a) GETS HPC Service Features

(1) GETS Call Recognition

This feature sets a trigger to recognize originating GETS calls based on the called number. The screen will be set on 710-NCS GETS on all switches and on four specific 800/888 numbers that provide access to GETS in certain switches only. A call to 710-NCS-GETS is marked as an HPC call.

(2) Trunk Group Queuing (TQ)

This feature provides the capability to queue HPC marked calls on specific trunk groups within the routing chain. Only HPC marked calls are allowed to queue.

(3) <u>Exemption From Network Management</u> <u>Controls (EX-NMCs)</u>

This feature provides HPC marked calls exemption from restrictive Network Management Controls that are invoked during times of excessive traffic on the Public Switched Telephone Network.
