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A1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

EXCHANGE SERVICE

Telecommunications service provided to subscribers within a specified geographical area for local calling and access to toll services. Exchange service is provided on either an Area Calling Service, flat, measured¹ or message¹ rate basis, for individual or party line service, PBX trunks, Centrex Type Services access facilities, or other exchange access facilities. (T)

a. Flat

(1) Flat Rate Service:

A classification of exchange service for which a stipulated charge is made, regardless of the amount of use for calls to the Limited Local Calling Area.

b. Usage Based Pricing

(1) Measured Rate Service:

A classification of exchange service for which usage charges apply for outward completed local calls in addition to a stipulated monthly charge. Some measured service rates include a monthly allowance for dialed sent paid local calls. Usage charges are based on the following elements; number of calls, duration, time of day, day of week and distance between originating and terminating wire centers.

(2) Message Rate Service:

A classification of non-coin box exchange service which includes an individual line with an allowance for a certain number of completed outward local calls for a stipulated monthly charge. A charge per message applies for all outward completed local calls in excess of the allowance.

(3) Area Calling Service

A classification of exchange service on which usage charges apply for outward completed calls within the Full Local Calling Area, in addition to a stipulated monthly charge. Usage charges are based on number of calls, duration, time of day, day of week, and distance between originating and terminating wire centers.

c. Individual and Party Line

(1) Individual Line Service:

A classification of exchange service which provides that only one main station shall be served by the line connecting such station with the central office or other switching unit.

(2) Party Line Service:

A classification of exchange service which provides that two main stations may be served by the same central office line. This service is also referred to as two-party line service. Effective July 10, 1993, this service is not offered for new installations or transfers of service to a new location.

d. Foreign Central Office Service:

A classification of exchange service furnished to a subscriber in a multi-office exchange from a central office other than the one from which service would normally be furnished and which provides the same local calling area.

e. Foreign Exchange Service:

A classification of exchange service furnished to a subscriber from an exchange other than the one from which he would normally be served, or from a sub-exchange area which provides a different local calling area from that provided by the normal serving sub-exchange area.

f. Touch-Tone Calling Service:

A classification of exchange service furnished from certain specified central offices whereby calls are originated through the use of pushbutton in lieu of a rotary dial.

A1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

LONG DURATION CALLS

Calls which last a duration of a minimum of two successive midnights. Long Duration Calls which are billed on a usage basis, will be subject to billing which additionally bills the call as a new call for each 24 hour period or fraction thereof, past the second midnight recorded.

MAIN STATION

See "Station".

MEASURED RATE SERVICE (*Business*)

See "Exchange Service".

MESSAGE

A communication between two stations. Messages may be classified as follows.

- a. Local Message:
A message between stations within the same local service area.
- b. Long Distance Message:
A message between stations in different exchange areas for which a long distance message charge is made.

MESSAGE RATE SERVICE (*Business*)

See "Exchange Service".

MILEAGE AND ZONE CHARGES

A charge applying for the use of part or all of a line furnished by the Company.

a. Airline Measurement:

The shortest distance between two points.

b. (DELETED)

c. Foreign Central Office Mileage:

The measurement applying to a line within the exchange connecting a subscriber's main station, PBX, or Centrex Type Services system with a central office other than that from which he would normally be served, for the use of which a separate circuit charge is made in addition to the base rate, plus locality charges if any apply.

d. Foreign Exchange Mileage:

The measurement applying to a line connecting a subscriber's main station, PBX, or Centrex Type Services system with a central office of an exchange other than that from which the subscriber would normally be served, for the use of which a separate charge is made in addition to the base rate, plus locality charges if any apply.

e. Route Measurement:

The actual length of a circuit between two points.

MISCELLANEOUS COMMON CARRIERS

Miscellaneous Common Carriers, as defined in Part 21 of the Federal Communications Commission Rules, are communications common carriers which are not engaged in the business of providing either a public landline message telephone service or public message telegraph service.

MOBILE TELEPHONE SERVICE

A communication service through a land radiotelephone base station.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING

The transmission of signals used in the telecommunications system which perform functions such as supervision (control, status, and charging signals), address signaling (dialing), calling and called number identification, audible tone signals (call progress signals indicating reorder or busy conditions, alerting, coin denominations, coin collect and coin return tones) to control the operation of switching machines in the telecommunications system.

NETWORK INTERFACE

Network Interface is a FCC approved standard registration program jack provided by the Company as a part of exchange access, WATS, or Private Line Services for the connection of customer inside wire and/or equipment to the telephone network. The Network Interface will be located at the demarcation point.

NON-LISTED (SEMIPRIVATE) LISTING

A non-listed listing is not in the alphabetical section of the Company's directory, but is maintained on directory assistance records and will be furnished upon the request of a calling party.

NON-PUBLISHED (PRIVATE) LISTING

A non-published listing is not listed in either the alphabetical section of the Company's directory or directory assistance records and will not be furnished upon request of a calling party.

NONSENT-PAID CALL¹

A call that is billed collect, third number or other Company-approved identification number. See "Sent-Paid Call".

Note 1: Effective March 19, 2016, Collect, Person to Person, Bill to a Third Number calls, Local Verification/Interruption Service and Zero Minus (0-) Charging services are discontinued.

A2.3.1 Availability Of Facilities (Cont'd)

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1. Intracompany Procedures (Cont'd)

- f. All buildings and premises of a subscriber on his continuous property are considered to be in the same area.
- g. All buildings and premises on the continuous property of a common endeavor, such as an estate, amusement park, or airport, are considered to be in the same area as the owner or operator of the common endeavor. Each occupant of such building or premises may subscribe to his own service; however, this procedure is applicable to every occupant of such building or premises, whether or not a part of or concerned in the common endeavor.
- h. In developments, such as trailer parks, tourist camps, and housing projects, where the buildings, trailers, or other structures are occupied by persons who are not a part of a common endeavor, private streets, roads, and driveways in such developments are considered, under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs, to be public roads for the purpose of determining the road to which a building, trailer or other structure has an entrance. Each building, trailer and other structure is considered separately for the purposes of determining the area from which it will be served.

2. Intercompany Procedures

Beginning on April 8, 1989, the following procedures will be used with respect to establishing intercompany boundaries of exchange areas. Intercompany exchange boundaries will be administered according to the geographical location of the customer's principal premises except in the following cases:

- a. All units of a multi-unit building, such as a two family house, an apartment house, or an industrial building, are considered to be in the same area.
- b. All buildings and premises on the continuous property of a common endeavor, such as an estate, amusement park, or airport, are considered to be in the same area as the owner or operator of the common endeavor. Each occupant may subscribe to his own service; however, this procedure is applicable to every occupant of such buildings or premises, whether or not a part of or concerned in the common endeavor.

A2.3.2 Flat, Measured¹ And Message¹ Rate Service

A. When Flat, Standard Measured, Low-Use Measured, Message rate or Area Calling Service types of service are offered in an area, an applicant may, at his option, select either type of service or combination of services for the applicant's private residence location.

An applicant at a business location may select either flat, measured or message rate service when they are available in the exchange. However, a combination of these different types of services will not be furnished to the same subscriber at the same business location. Different applicants at the same business location, even in the same office, may each subscribe to a different type of service as long as each applicant has a different account and the applicants do not share a communication or other key-type system. The exceptions to the mixing restrictions for business locations are listed following:

- 1. To hotel and hospital premises where Flat Rate Service may be provided for the exclusive use of hotel or hospital management, in addition to the Area Calling Service, Measured or Message Service ordinarily provided in guests' or patients' rooms and lobbies, or Flat Rate Service may be provided in guests' or patients' rooms in addition to Flat Rate Service for management use in hotels and hospitals. This exception does not permit the combining of Area Calling Service, Measured and Message Rate Trunks. Guests or patients may contract separately for one of the services that may otherwise be available to them.
- 2. To premises where pay telephones may properly be located.
- 3. To premises where Back-Up Line service may properly be located with flat rate primary line service.
- 4. To premises where Flat Rate Service is used for voice transmission and usage rate service is used for transmission of medical information only, for emergency purposes only, for answering machines only, for fax machines only, or for computer data communications only, and the usage lines are not part of the primary voice system at that location. It shall also apply for premises where usage service is used for voice transmission and flat rate service is used for the same purposes stated above.
- 5. To premises where toll terminals are located.
- 6. To premises which have Premium Area Calling Service and request Business Flat Rate Service for additional lines or which have Business Flat Rate Service and request Premium Area Calling Service for additional lines.

A3. BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

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A3. BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

A3.1 General

- A.** Rates for Basic Local Exchange Service are related to the total number of main station lines (including Centrex Type Services main station lines, except as provided following,) and PBX trunks (including trunks providing Service to U.S. Government-owned systems serving certified military bases) in the Limited Local Calling Area.
- B.** Local Exchange Service, Exchange Service Areas, and Local Calling Areas for each exchange are set out in this Guidebook.
- C.** The rates for service and equipment not specifically shown in this section are presented in other sections of this Guidebook.
- D.** Individual (Ind.) and two-party (2-Pty.) line Residence and Business Main Station Line Service are comprised of serving central office line equipment and outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer premises at the demarcation point. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for Message Toll Service and for local calling.
- E.** Measured Rate^f Main Station Line or Trunk Service is available only to those customers subscribing to the service on January 19, 1984, or who had ordered the service by that date for later installation. The service will remain available to those subscribers only in those central offices which were furnishing the service on January 19, 1984. (T)
- F.** Pursuant to KPSC Administrative Case No. 333, a monthly surcharge shall be imposed on all local exchange access lines, MultiServ service lines and MultiServ PLUS service lines or in the case of ESSX service and Centrex service, per Network Access Register (NAR). For purposes of application of this surcharge, access lines are defined as facilities which provide access to and from the telecommunications network for toll service and for local calling with the exception of Public Coin, WATS, Remote Call Forwarding, Radio Common Carriers, InterLATA Foreign Exchange Lines, Private Line Services, Mobile, Other Common Carriers, and Company Official Accounts. The Commission has determined in KPSC Administrative Case No. 372, Order dated February 16, 2009, that the amount of the surcharge will be \$.02 per access line effective June 1, 2009; however, this amount is subject to change by the Commission to meet the needs of providing Telecommunications Relay Service for the hearing and/or speech impaired persons in Kentucky. Pursuant to KPSC Administrative Case No. 372, Order dated May 31, 2006, the Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TDD) distribution program shall be renamed Telecommunications Access Program (TAP) and shall be funded by a monthly surcharge of \$.02 per access line beginning with bills rendered after July 1, 2006. As of December 1, 1999, the surcharge was combined with the Telecommunications Relay Service surcharge. The resulting combined surcharge (\$.04 per access line from June 1, 2009) shall appear as a separate line item on the customer's bill and shall read "TRS/TAP Surcharge."
- G.** Effective July 10, 1993 two-party (2-Pty) line service is being obsoleted. This service will not be offered for new installations or transfers of service to a new location. Effective January 24, 1994, the Company will begin a program to upgrade two-party customers to individual line service. Customers will be notified prior to their service being changed. When upgraded, residential customers will be allowed to continue paying two-party zone charges (see Section A103.) until one of the following occurs: transfer of service to new location; additional line(s) added; or requested relocation of Company facilities.
- H.** Residence Access Line Retention Offer
Existing residential customers who call to disconnect service with AT&T and elect to stay and have one (or up to a maximum of two) access line(s) may be eligible to receive a \$6 per month bill credit for 12 months. The following conditions apply:
1. Customers must keep the required services for 30 days to receive the benefit of this offer.
 2. Customers subscribing to Complete Choice Enhanced or Complete Choice Basic must have the access line in service for a minimum of 60 days before the customer becomes eligible for this offer.
 3. If the customer disconnects the line(s) or moves from their current location, the remaining benefits will cease.
 4. AT&T employees are not eligible for this offer.
 5. Customer must be calling into AT&T to disconnect their local service.
 6. This offer is available on a maximum of two (2) lines (a maximum monthly reward of \$12).
 7. Not stackable with any other regulated retention offer that provides a monthly discount.
 8. Eligible customers are existing AT&T residential customers who have a primary access line, or a primary access line with an additional access line(s), and are calling to disconnect one or more access lines.
 9. This offer is only available for retention purposes.
 10. The monthly bill credit stays in effect as long as the customer remains at the same address and is limited to a maximum of 12 months.
 11. Eligible customers may only receive this offer once during the offer benefit period.

A3. BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

A3.1 General (Cont'd)

- I. Pursuant KPSC Administrative Case No. 360, a monthly Intrastate Universal Service Surcharge shall be imposed on all local exchange access lines, MultiServ service lines and MultiServ PLUS service lines or in the case of ESSX service and Centrex service, per Network Access Register (NAR). For purposes of application of this surcharge, access lines are defined as facilities which provide access to and from the telecommunications network for toll service and for local calling with the exception of WATS, Remote Call Forwarding, Radio Common Carriers, InterLATA Foreign Exchange Lines, Private Line Services, Mobile, Interexchange Carriers, and Company Official Accounts. The Commission has determined in Case No. 2016-00059, Order dated March 10, 2016, that the amount of the surcharge will be \$.14 per access line; however, this amount is subject to change by the Commission to meet the needs of the Universal Service Fund in Kentucky. The surcharge shall appear as a separate line item on the customer's bill.

A3.2 Statewide Rate Schedules

A3.2.1 Flat Rate Schedule

The rates specified herein entitle subscribers to an unlimited number of messages to all stations bearing the designation of central offices within the serving exchange and Limited Local Calling Area exchanges as shown in A3.6, Local Calling Areas.

- A. The following schedule of monthly rates is applicable to Flat Rate Main Station Line Service:

- 1. Rate groups include total main station lines and PBX trunks.

Individual Line Measured Rate Service is available only in certain central offices of the exchanges shown herein. Measured Rate Service requires special equipment and arrangements and is furnished only when such equipment and arrangements are available. The rates specified entitle subscribers to complete local calls on a usage charge basis to stations in the Limited Local Calling Area, i.e., all stations bearing the designation of central offices of the serving exchange and Limited Local Calling Area exchanges as shown in A3.6, Local Calling Areas. Charges for local usage are specified in A3.2, and are based on mechanized records kept of all calls originated on the line.

When a customer subscribes to more than one measured rate line on the same premises and the lines are group billed on the same service account, the local usage charges on all such lines are combined. If usage allowances are applicable, they are also combined to determine the amount of charges for usage in excess of such allowances. Usage charges and/or usage allowances shall not be combined for measured rate lines structured on separate service accounts, even though one account might be "billed to" another account for the purpose of rendering one bill to the subscriber.

In locations where Measured Rate Individual Line Service is available, it will replace the current Individual Line Message Rate Service. Existing Individual Line Message Rate subscribers will have the choice of converting to either Flat or Measured Rate Service.

- C. The following mileage bands and rates apply for all usage within the Limited Local Calling Area. This schedule is not applicable for any service established after Area Calling Service¹ is offered in an exchange. Usage charges will be billed in arrears. Partial minutes count as full minutes for each individual call completed.

- D. Lower rates for the Evening and Night and Weekend rate periods are expressed as a percent reduction of the usage rates stated herein. The rate is applied to the total summarized usage charge for those portions of all messages occurring within the reduced rate period. When application of the reduced rate results in a fractional charge, the amount will be rounded to the nearer whole cent.

No reduced rate applies for that portion of messages in the Day rate period.

When messages span more than one rate period, total charges for the minutes in each rate period are summarized, any reduced rate applied and the results for each rate period are totaled to obtain the total message charge.

- E. On Christmas Day (December 25), New Year's Day (January 1), Independence Day (July 4), Thanksgiving Day and Labor Day, the holiday rate applicable is the Evening rate, unless a lower rate would normally apply.
- F. Usage charges may be billed to other numbers.
- G. Usage charges apply to local calls completed with operator assistance in addition to Operator Assisted Local Call surcharges, when applicable. Such calls are itemized on the subscriber's billing statement and are billed outside any applicable usage allowances for dialed sent paid calls.

A9. FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE AND FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE SERVICE

A9.1 Foreign Exchange Service¹ (Cont'd)

A9.1.3 Rates And Charges

A. Methods Of Applying Rates

The rate for Foreign Exchange Service is the installation and monthly rate for Exchange Access plus mileage, as specified in A9.1.3. For Centrex Type Services off-premises station channels the Centrex Type Services rate applicable within the serving foreign exchange applies, and for residence customers the Flat Individual Line Main Station rate for the serving foreign exchange applies plus mileage and installation specified in A9.1.3, and the nonrecurring charges specified in Section A4. Interexchange mileage measurements and the allowance for interruptions on interexchange channels are those specified for voice grade channels in the Private Line Guidebook.

(C)

B. Interexchange Channel

Charges for the Interexchange Channel are based on airline distance between rate centers when the Company provides both the open and closed ends of the service (a rate center may also sometimes be referred to as a "principal" or "primary" wire center or central office). When either the open or closed end of the service is provided by another company, the interexchange mileage between the Company's rate center and the point from which the other company bases its mileage charge is determined and billed pursuant to A9.1.1.H and A9.1.2.A.

C. Interoffice Channel

1. When Foreign Exchange Service is provided from a Wire Center that is not the primary Wire Center, interoffice mileage charges apply. Charges are based on the airline distance between the primary Wire Center and the Wire Center of the serving central office.
2. When Foreign Exchange Service is terminated in a Wire Center that is not the primary Wire Center area, interoffice mileage charges apply. Charges are based on the airline distance between the primary Wire Center and the Wire Center of the normal serving central office.

D. Provided facilities are available and technical equipment allows, extension station service will be furnished in the foreign exchange. The charge quoted in Section A13 for channels for extension line applies for each station.

E. (DELETED)

F. The Local Service Area of, and Long Distance rates to and from main stations or PBX systems connected for Foreign Exchange Service are the same as regularly apply to stations located in the foreign exchange area.

Note 1: Applies to all service ordered on or after October 25, 1978 and any service ordered prior to October 25, 1978 but installed after a normal installation interval. Any other subscriber may retain their previous service arrangement only as long as that same subscriber retains the same telephone number at the same premises.

A13. MISCELLANEOUS SERVICE ARRANGEMENTS

A13.20 Call Screening And Restriction Services - Customized Code Restriction (CCR)

A13.20.1 General

Customized Code Restriction is a service which enables customers to restrict certain types of outgoing calls from being placed over their exchange lines/trunks. This capability is provided only by means of recorded announcement restriction. It is offered with options containing various sets of codes to be restricted, and is available to basic exchange customers with individual line residence or business service or PBX trunks in either flat, message^l or measured^l rate service environments.

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A13.20.2 Terms and Conditions

- A. Customers may subscribe to whichever option meets their needs, but only one option may be provided on a line/trunk or group of lines/trunks. Also, options of this service may not be combined with Selective Class of Call Screening in A13.12, or Toll Trunks specified in A13.14.
