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PURPOSE: Increase Business Local Service monthly charges.

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A3. BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

A3.1 General (Cont'd)

- I. Pursuant to KPSC Administrative Case No. 2016-0059, a monthly Intrastate Universal Service Surcharge shall be imposed on all local exchange access lines, MultiServ service lines and MultiServ PLUS service lines or in the case of ESSX service and Centrex service, per Network Access Register (NAR). For purposes of application of this surcharge, access lines are defined as facilities which provide access to and from the telecommunications network for toll service and for local calling with the exception of WATS, Remote Call Forwarding, Radio Common Carriers, InterLATA Foreign Exchange Lines, Private Line Services, Mobile, Interexchange Carriers, and Company Official Accounts. The Commission has determined in KPSC Administrative Case No. 2016-0059, Order dated February 15, 2019, that the amount of the surcharge will be \$.07 per access line; however, this amount is subject to change by the Commission to meet the needs of the Universal Service Fund in Kentucky. The surcharge shall appear as a separate line item on the customer's bill.

A3.2 Statewide Rate Schedules

A3.2.1 Flat Rate Schedule

The rates specified herein entitle subscribers to an unlimited number of messages to all stations bearing the designation of central offices within the serving exchange and Limited Local Calling Area exchanges as shown in A3.6, Local Calling Areas.

A3.2.3 Measured Rate Schedule (Business)

Individual Line Measured Rate Service is available only in certain central offices of the exchanges shown herein. Measured Rate Service requires special equipment and arrangements and is furnished only when such equipment and arrangements are available. The rates specified entitle subscribers to complete local calls on a usage charge basis to stations in the Limited Local Calling Area, i.e., all stations bearing the designation of central offices of the serving exchange and Limited Local Calling Area exchanges as shown in A3.6, Local Calling Areas. Charges for local usage are specified in A3.2, and are based on mechanized records kept of all calls originated on the line.

A13.14 Toll Trunks (Toll Terminals)

A13.14.1 General

- A. A toll trunk is a special access trunk extending from a customer's premises to the Company's premises for the purpose of completing toll calls originated at the customer's location. These facilities may be arranged to:
 - 1. Route all long distance calls to an operator for completion.
 - 2. Route all Dial Station-to-Station calls directly to a toll network and route all other long distance calls to an operator for completion.
- B. A toll trunk may be arranged, at the customer's request, for Selective Class of Call Screening Service, as outlined in Section A13. This service enables a customer, by means of an operator, to restrict outgoing toll calls from station users to certain types of calls such as those which are charged to the called number¹ or a third number¹.
- C. Connections will not be established between a toll trunk and exchange station lines or other toll trunks in the exchange area where the toll trunk is located.
- D. Toll trunks are furnished only to customers who have local exchange service concurrently. Also, all local calls and calls to certain Company numbers such as repair service, Public Emergency Service (911), etc. will be permitted from the customer's establishment only on regular exchange service facilities of the customer.
- E. Outward connections only will be established from a toll trunk.
- F. Service arrangements, requested by the customer, in excess of the intent of this Guidebook may be provided at charges based on cost.
- G. This service is furnished only where facilities permit.
- H. If appropriate, in addition to rates and charges listed following, Company Foreign Exchange channel charges are applicable when this service is extended over such dedicated facilities from a foreign exchange.

c. Dedicated Facilities

When dedicated direct arrangements are provided from exchanges other than that in which the PSAP is located due to the customer's request or when dedicated-direct arrangements are provided from exchanges that do not have local calling to the exchange in which the PSAP is located, charges for Foreign Exchange or Foreign Central Office Service will apply as specified in Section A9.

d. Inter-Office Lines

Non-dedicated lines required between central offices are provided at no charge when the central offices involved are located in exchanges which have local calling to the exchange in which the PSAP is located.

f. PSAP Terminal Equipment

Customer-provided equipment furnished to terminate 911 Exchange Lines at any PSAP will be required to conform to the general provisions set forth in Section A15.

g. Tie lines, private lines, extension lines and other such channels connecting a PSAP to various agencies such as police, fire or ambulance service, are provided at current rates for such channels and facilities as specified in this and other appropriate service publications.

Note 1: This Guidebook is applicable to new systems or additions to existing systems ordered on or after June 14, 1979.

D. Application of Rates (Cont'd)

2. Central Office Data Set

- a. This option connects an Access Channel to a data set at a terminating central office. Several types of data set connections are provided according to the type of associated Access Channel and transmission speed desired by the customer.
- b. The 2.4 Kbps Dial Central Office Data Set shown in A29.2.3 is capable of transmitting/receiving a data signal at the speed of 2.4 Kbps. It also has an autobaud detection feature which allows it to adapt its speed to the speed of the call originating customer premises data set. In this autobaud mode this data set functions at 2400/1200/300 bps.
- c. The 9.6 Kbps Dial Central Office Data Set Shown in A29.2.3 is capable of transmitting/receiving a data signal at the speed of 9.6 Kbps. It also has an autobaud detection feature which allows it to adapt its speed to the speed of the call originating customer premises data set. In this autobaud mode this data set functions at 9600/2400/1200/300 bps.
