PURPOSE: Increase business Local Service monthly charges

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A3. BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

A3.1 General

- A. Rates for basic local exchange service are related to the total main station lines; main Centrex Type Services station lines and private branch exchange trunks in the Basic Local Calling Area as described in A3.6.
- B. Base Rate Areas, Zone Rate Areas, and Exchange Service Areas for each exchange are identified on maps filed as a supplement to the Guidebook.
- C. The rate for service and equipment not specifically shown in this section are presented in other sections.
- D. Individual main station line service is comprised of serving central office line equipment and all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer premises at the demarcation point. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for message toll service and for local calling appropriate to the offering selected by the customer.
- E. Effective with billing periods on or after May 13, 1987, a subscriber line charge is implemented at the rates shown following. The subscriber line charge is applicable to each working access line.

- F. As authorized in LPSC General Order dated April 29, 2005, a monthly surcharge may be imposed for the recovery of expenses paid to the State Universal Service Fund (SUSF). This fee/surcharge will appear on retail (not wholesale) customer bills as "LA Universal Service Fee" and will be applied to access lines, trunks and NARs (Network Access Registers). The fee will not be applied to Lifeline services, private lines or ISDN B-channels.

- C. Provide a majority of its services free of charge and utilize any compensation received for its services wholly in the prosecution of its charitable work, not resulting in any profit to the organization or any member thereof.
- D. Are engaged principally in the furnishing of direct aid to the physical health and comfort of human beings in the form of money, services, or necessary commodities. For determining eligibility for concession service, those corporations, associations and institutions whose principle work is the elevation or enlightenment of minds or morals, or the reformation, punishment, or correction of acts, habits or mental conditions, or the enforcement of law, or the protection of rights, are not to be classed as charitable institutions.
- E. Communication equipment furnished at concession rates for charitable institutions must be located in the administrative offices, institutional buildings or any of the branches thereof.

A3.19 Grouping Service

A3.19.1 General

Grouping service is a combination of two or more individual lines connected to the central office so that incoming calls to the listed number overflow to the next available line if the listed number is busy. This service is available with flat, Local Optional Service Option B, measured or message rate business individual lines, BellSouth Business Plus service lines, business PBX trunks, ESSX service Network Access Register (NARs), MultiServ PLUS service NARs, and BellSouth Centrex service NARs.

A3.19.2 Rates

A. Business

A monthly rate for a grouping service applies for each line in addition to the regular business individual line, BellSouth Business Plus service lines, business PBX trunk, MultiServ PLUS service NAR, BellSouth Centrex service NAR, or ESSX service NAR rate.

B. Residence¹

1. A monthly rate for grouping service only applies when a subscriber has at least four, but no more than ten lines in a grouping arrangement at a private residence location where a business listing is not employed in the Company's directory. If more than ten lines are required in a grouping arrangement, business grouping service rates must apply for all lines in the grouping arrangement. See Section A2 for additional regulations.
2. In accordance with the Louisiana Public Service Commission Order No. U-22215-A dated July 6, 1998, existing subscribers as of May 20, 1998 with more than three (3) residence service lines in rotary or grouping arrangements at their private residence shall be grandfathered for a period of five (5) years. After May 20, 2003, these subscribers shall convert their existing grouping arrangements to comply with the new provisions specified in Section A3. However, additional lines ordered for grouping arrangements by these subscribers or requests for moves of their existing arrangements after May 20, 1998 shall be subject to the provisions specified in A3.19.2.B.1.

Note 1: This provision became effective on May 20, 1998.

A9. FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE AND FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE SERVICE

A9.2 Foreign Central Office Service

A9.2.1 General

- A. Foreign Central Office Service is exchange service furnished to a subscriber in a multi-office exchange from a central office other than the one from which service would normally be furnished.
- B. Foreign Central Office Service is offered in connection with Individual Line Main Station Service, PBX Service and Centrex Type Services only.
- C. Other services, equipment or facilities used in connection with Foreign Central Office Service, except as otherwise indicated in this Guidebook, are furnished subject to the rates and regulations applying in the foreign central office from which the subscriber is served.
- D. Alternate routing of this service may be provided on a direct serve basis to the subscriber's premises from the requested foreign central office on an individual case basis as specified in Section A5, subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. The subscriber must maintain a minimum of fifty percent of the trunks/lines from the central office from which service would normally be furnished.
 - 2. Rates and charges for all components of the service will continue to apply as specified in A9.2.2.A. and B, with the exception of those applicable for Type 2145 channel(s). The monthly rate for the class of service desired will be based on the rates applicable from the foreign central office, but will be no less than the rates for that service from the subscriber's normal serving wire center. Additionally, rates and charges as specified in A5 will apply on an individual case basis.

A9.2.2 Rates And Charges

- A. Methods Of Applying Rates
 The rate for Foreign Central Office Service is the monthly rate for the class of service desired, plus a foreign central office mileage charge as shown in A9.2.2 for the distance, airline measurement, between the central office from which the subscriber would normally be served and the foreign central office (i.e., the central office from which the subscriber desires to be served). In addition the subscriber is charged any Zone Charges which would apply for connection with the central office from which service would be rendered.

A12.7 Direct-Inward Dialing (DID) Service

A12.7.1 Rules And Regulations

- A. DID service permits calls incoming to a PBX or other CPE from the network to reach a specific station line number without the assistance of an attendant. DID service is provided subject to the availability of facilities and may be furnished from the central office which regularly serves the area in which the customer is located or from a foreign central office equipped to provide DID service subject to the appropriate intra/interexchange rates.
- B. Rates are in addition to the rates shown elsewhere in this and other Company service publications for the services and equipment with which this offering is associated.
- C. The service includes central office switching equipment necessary for in-dialing from the network directly to station lines associated with customer premises switching equipment.
- D. The service must be provided on all trunks in a group arranged. Each trunk group shall be considered a separate service. Grouping Service will not be provided between separate trunk groups.
- E. Facilities and operational characteristics of interface signals between the Company-provided connecting arrangements and the customer provided switching equipment must conform to the rules and regulations the Company considers necessary to maintain proper standards of service.
- F. One primary directory listing will be furnished without charge for each separate trunk group. Additional listings can be obtained as specified in Section A6.
- G. The customer shall be responsible for providing interception of calls to vacant and non-working assigned DID numbers by means of attendant intercept or recorded announcement service.
- H. DID numbers are provided in blocks consisting of a minimum of 20 numbers which may be assigned to station lines or reserved for future use at rates specified herein. The Company does not guarantee to provide a number block consecutive to any other number block or to provide DID numbers arranged in a consecutive manner. If the DID numbers provided cannot be arranged in a consecutive manner, they will still be provided at rates and charges for consecutive numbers. When a number is removed from an existing consecutive DID number group, the installation charge and monthly rates for Non-Consecutive DID apply to the remaining numbers. If a customer requesting Non-Consecutive DID numbers does not have DID service at the time the Non-Consecutive DID numbers are requested, a minimum of 20 Non-Consecutive DID numbers must be ordered. The Company will be responsible for interception and administration of reserved numbers.
Automatic Intercept Service (AIS) for a non-listed disconnected DID number will be provided at the rate shown in A12.7.2A, where facilities permit. AIS will provide a referral to the corresponding new number for a maximum period of twelve months or until the delivery of the new Real White/Yellow Pages directory, whichever comes first.

A12.8 Identified-Outward Dialing (IOD) From Private Branch Exchange Systems

- A. The service is furnished subject to the availability of facilities and numbers.
- B. The service includes the central office equipment necessary for identification of outgoing toll calls and billing of toll calls by number.
- C. The service must be provided on all trunks or lines in a group.
- D. The minimum contract period for the service is three years. In case of discontinuance or reduction of service within the minimum contract period a basic termination charge as shown in the rates below, reduced by 1/36 for each full month of service provided, shall be applied.
- E. Where Identified-Outward-Dialing is requested on more than one group of trunks or lines, each such group shall be considered a separate service.
- F. The rates herein contemplate the use of standard equipment and serving arrangements. When equipment or service of a special type is requested and provided, rates and charges are based on the additional costs involved to meet the individual requirements of each case.
- G. Operational characteristics of interface signals between Company-provided connecting arrangements and customer-provided equipment must conform to the rules and regulations the Company considers necessary to maintain proper standards of service.
- H. The Company shall not be responsible to the customer or authorized user or joint user if changes in protection criteria or in any of the facilities, operations or procedures of the Company render any facilities provided by a customer, authorized user or joint user obsolete or require modification or alteration of such equipment or system or otherwise affect its use or performance.

Note 1: In addition to the rates and charges for DID terminations, rates and charges for Flat Rate Inward or DID Combination Trunks as specified in A3 apply as appropriate.

Note 2: Combination Trunks with the Call Transfer feature are only provisioned from 5ESS switches where facilities permit.

Note 3: Provide faster signaling on DID trunks. The choice of pulsing alternative depends on the customer's premises equipment

Note 4: Provides automatic referral of calls from a non-listed disconnected DID number to a corresponding new number for twelve months or until the delivery of the new directory, whichever comes first. AIS is available only where facilities permit.

- A. Back-Up Line is an optional service which provides business subscribers with an additional line which is available for inward and outward calling.
- B. This service is only available to business subscribers, where facilities permit. Back-Up Line service cannot be used as the primary business line, and must be located on the same premises as the business service with which it is associated.
- C. Each Back-Up Line can receive calls forwarded from one busy primary line or hunt group at no charge. This overflow capability will be provided on the forwarding line.

If a customer subscribes to more than one Back-Up Line, these Back-Up Lines may be provisioned in an overflow group at no charge. Overflow capability may not be provided from a Back-Up Line or group of Back-Up Lines to other lines on the same premises.

- D. Overflow capability from additional primary lines or hunt groups to Back-Up Line service will be provided on the forwarding line.
