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TOLL RESTRICTION

A. Description of the Service

Toll Restriction is an optical central office service that restricts access to the network as defined herein. Restricted calls are directed to a central office announcement.

B. Limitations of the Service

1. Toll Restriction will be offered to Residence One-Party customers only.
2. Toll Restriction will be provided, where facilities permit, subject to the following:
 - a. Toll Restriction will not allow 1+, 0+, 0-, 10-xxx, 900, or interzone calls to be completed.^{/1/} (C)
 - b. Toll Restriction does not restrict local calls, calls to intraNPA Directory Assistance, Telephone Repair Service, Emergency Services such as 9-1-1, or calls to 800 or 950 numbers.
 - c. Toll Restrictions will not be offered in areas where 9-1-1 is not available.
 - d. Toll billing exception may apply to prevent collect calls and calls billed to a third party.^{/1/} (C)
 - e. Blocking of 976 or other intraLATA CIS Services will be offered free of charge.
3. Toll Restriction does not relieve customers of responsibility for calls charged to their telephone number(s).
4. The Company shall not be liable to the customer or any other person or entity for damages of any nature or kind arising out of, resulting from, or in connection with the provision of the service, including without limitation, the inability to access the operator or any non toll free number for any purpose.

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TOLL DIVERSION ARRANGEMENTS

A. Type 1

1. Description

Toll Diversion arrangements are available to divert station users from long distance and interzone access codes as indicated herein.

- a. Type I Toll Diversion is a central office feature available with Company provided Centrex systems or customer premises equipment.
- b. After April 28, 1984, new installations of Type I Toll Diversion will be provided only from ESS central offices or from electromechanical central offices that are equipped for this feature.
- c. Two classes of toll diversion are available: (1) to divert all long distance and interzone calls and (2) to divert all long distance calls only. If the customer has both classes of toll diversion, the rates and charges in 2.b. following apply for each class of toll diversion.
- d. When a station user attempts to dial a restricted call the call will be diverted. Depending upon the circumstances and facilities available, the call will be diverted to a distinctive tone, a recorded announcement, or to a PBX switchboard. If a PBX is equipped with Toll Terminals, long distance calls may be placed directly by the station user by dialing a preset code.

2. Charges

- a. The charges indicated below are in addition to all charges applicable to the class of service and stations with which the features are associated and for any miscellaneous services provided.

B. Type II

1. Description

- a. Type II Toll Diversion is available with Centrex CO Systems.
- b. Two classes of toll diversion are available: (1) to divert all long distance and inter--zone calls outside the local calling area, and (2) to divert all long distance calls only.
- c. When a user of a station line or tie line equipped with toll diversion dials a restricted code, the call will be diverted. Depending upon circumstances and facilities available, the call will be diverted to either a common Centrex announcement or to a distinctive tone to indicate that such calls cannot be completed as dialed.

2. Charges

- a. The charges indicated below are in addition to the regular charges for station lines or tie lines.
- b. If a customer has more than one class of toll diversion described in 1.b. preceding, the rates and charges apply for each class of toll diversion provided.
- c. Station Lines and Tie Lines - Business service:

d. Station Lines - Dormitory Service

- (1) At the time service is established and at the beginning of a new school year, term, or semester no charge is applicable to provide or to remove Toll Diversion on Centrex dormitory service lines.

2. Charges (Cont'd)

d. Station Lines - Dormitory Service (Cont'd)

- (2) Provision of Toll Diversion at a time other than specified in (1) preceding. A nonrecurring charge of \$4.59 applies for each station line changed to Toll Diversion except that no charge is applicable where the Company initiates such a change involving a delinquent account under the Special Toll Billing Arrangement.
- (3) Removal of Toll Diversion at a time other than specified in (1) preceding. No charge is applicable for removal of Toll Diversion except as indicated in the following:

Where the Company has placed the service on Toll Diversion because of a delinquent account and subsequently the account is reinstated for the Special Toll Billing Arrangement a nonrecurring charge of \$4.59 applies for the removal of Toll Diversion.

C. TYPE III

I. Description

- a. The Type III arrangement provides toll diversion on Foreign Exchange (FX) trunks.
- b. Type III Toll Diversion is available with all types of Dial Switching systems where facilities permit.
- c. Type III Toll Diversion is available from any central office equipped to provide this feature.
- d. Two classes of toll diversion are available: (1) to divert all long distance and interzone calls outside the local calling area, (2) to divert all long distance calls only.
- e. When a station user dials a restricted code, the call will be diverted. Depending upon circumstances and facilities available, the call will be diverted to either a recorded announcement or to a distinctive tone to indicate that such calls cannot be completed as dialed.

TOLL DIVERSION ARRANGEMENTS (Cont'd)

D. TYPE IV

1. Description

- a. The Type IV Toll Diversion arrangement diverts all message toll calls placed to telephone numbers outside of the customer's home numbering plan area.
- b. When a station user dials a restricted code, the call will be diverted to either a recorded announcement or to a distinctive tone to indicate that such calls cannot be completed as dialed.
- c. Type IV Toll Diversion is provided only with Centrex CO systems served from ESS central offices equipped to provide this feature.
- d. When an update of a No. 2 ESS central office is required specifically to provide this service, a nonrecurring charge specified in Part 3, Section 1, in this Guidebook is applicable. (C)

The following rate and charges are in addition to the rates for station lines.
