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# A6. LISTINGS

# A6.1 Terms and Conditions Applicable To Directory Listings

#### A6.1.1 General

- **A.** The Rates, *Terms and Conditions* for directory listings in this section apply only to the alphabetical listings containing the regular alphabetical list of names of customers and joint users. The alphabetical list of names of customers is for the purpose of informing calling parties of the telephone numbers of customers.
- **B.** The listings of subscribers either without charge or at the rate specified herein for other listings are arranged alphabetically and are not intended for special prominence of arrangement. In accepting listings as requested by subscribers or prospective subscribers, the Company will not be a party to controversies between subscribers as a result of the inclusion of such listings in the Company's Listing Information System.
- **C.** Listings must conform to the Company's practices with respect to its listings. The Company reserves the right to reject listings when, in its sole judgment, such listings would violate the integrity of company records, confuse individuals using the Company's Listing Information System, are intended for advertising purposes, or when the customer cannot provide satisfactory evidence of authorization to do business as requested.
- **D.** The Company reserves the right to limit the length of any listing by use of abbreviations when, in its sole judgment, the clearness of the listing and the identification of the subscriber is not impaired thereby.
- E. Except as hereinafter provided only one listing is furnished without extra charge for each individual line service, PBX system, ESSX service, Digital ESSX service, or Centrex system; where a number of main services are provided on a rotary basis they are considered as one service. MultiServ service, MultiServ PLUS service, and BellSouth Centrex service listings are provided as specified in K. RingMaster service subscribers will be furnished one listing or semi-private listing without charge for every RingMaster service number. RingMaster service listings must be either business or residence as identified by the class of service. Primary Rate ISDN subscribers will be provided a listing for each B-Channel at no charge. If additional listings are required to properly identify the subscriber, such additional listings may be provided without charge to the extent that the number of listings allowed does not exceed the number of individual lines, the number of trunk lines in a PBX system, the number of exchange access trunks (with incoming call capability) in Centrex Type Services or the number of Network Access Register (NAR) Packages in an ESSX service or Digital ESSX service System. Listings showing the appropriate Centrex, ESSX service or Digital ESSX service station number may be furnished indented under the main listing or additional listings. Such listings may be specific departments, locations or titles of key personnel, but may not be names of individuals.
- **F.** Additional listings on rotary numbers usually bear the call number of the first line of the rotary group but, at the subscriber's request, they may bear any one of the rotary numbers.
- **G.** Generally, the listed address is the location of the subscriber's place of business or residence, including the appropriate zip code. At the subscriber's request a partial address may be listed. An address may be:
  - a number(s) and/or letter(s) followed by the name of a street, a building, when a clear distinction is made between the name of the building and the name of the thoroughfare, a shopping center/mall, apartment complex, industrial park, or similar facility
  - a name of a street, building, shopping center/mall, apartment complex, industrial park, or similar facility
  - any one of the above followed by a community and/or state name
  - a community name only
  - omitted at the subscriber's request

The listed address may not include P.O. Box or use of the word or abbreviation of suite, floor, or apartment before numbers used in the identification.

An address other than the address where the service is located may be listed provided the subscriber has a comparable class of service at the address requested and arrangements have been made for calls to that number to be answered.

Only the customer name and telephone number shall be included in the Company's Listing Information System for a Family Violence Shelter. The Company shall not include an address in its Listing Information System as part of the listing nor will it be available from directory assistance for a Family Violence Shelter.

H.	Liability of the Company due to errors and omissions in its Listing Information System is specified in Section A2.	(M)
I.	A Secondary Service Charge, as specified in Section A4., applies when an order is issued solely to add or change a listing.	(M)

- **J.** Listings can be suspended as specified in A2.3.16. However, the suspension rate shall be 50 percent of the regularly charged (M) rate.
- **K.** One listing is furnished without charge for each main station line associated with MultiServ service and for each Network (M) Access Register associated with MultiServ PLUS service and BellSouth Centrex service.

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### A6. LISTINGS

### A6.2 Business Listing

### A6.2.1 General

- A. Generally, a business listing consists of a name, a designation descriptive of the subscriber's business if not self-explanatory, the address at which service is rendered, and the business telephone number. The primary listing is ordinarily the name of the individual, firm or corporation which contracts for the service or the name under which a business is regularly conducted, but may be that of a second party designated by the subscriber. Additional listings may be furnished in the names of partners or members of the firm, if the subscriber or joint user is a partnership or firm; the names of officers of the corporation where the subscriber or joint user is a corporation, and for any business establishment, the names of associates or employees of the subscriber or joint user. Business additional listings may also be the bona fide names of individuals, firms or corporations which the subscriber or joint user owns or controls, or is duly authorized to and actually does represent. Listings other than those indicated above are furnished subject to the Rates, *Terms and Conditions* specified for "Joint User Service."
- **B.** All listings of a subscriber's services which are located on the same premises must bear the same address, except in the case of outside stations of PBX, Centrex Type Services, or main station service when the address may be shown as the premises where the outside station is located.

#### A6.2.2 Business Designation

- A. Firm Name
  - 1. The designation in a firm name business listing consists of a word or phrase, abbreviated where necessary, that describes the general character of the subscriber's business. Designations will not be used where the name under which the subscriber is doing business is sufficient to indicate the character of the business.

Example:

Lewis Co grocr 14 Madison

B. Personal Name

1. The designation in a personal name business listing consists of a word or phrase, abbreviated where necessary, that describes the general character of the subscriber's business. Designations will not be used where the name under which the subscriber is doing business is sufficient to indicate the character of the business. The listing of an individual, together with a title and the name of the business with which the individual is associated or represents, is not permitted. Example:

Smith J G grocr 14 Madison

2. A designation that conveys the same meaning as a title, educational degree or suffix is not permitted. Example:

Smith Joe DDS dntst

#### A6.2.3 Trade Name

A trade name or the name of a commodity or service will be included as part of the listing when the subscriber shows satisfactory evidence of authorization to do business under the requested name. The Company reserves the right to reject listings which appear to be designed primarily to give publicity to the commodity or service, which in its judgment are otherwise objectionable or unnecessary for identification purposes. In the case of listings for time/temperature/weather announcement services, a generic listing will be accepted.

Examples which require proof of authorization are:

### A6.3 Residence Listing

#### A6.3.1 General

Generally, a residence listing consists of a surname, given name, or dual name and/or initials, the address, and the number. When a single name listing is requested by the subscriber, the Company may require satisfactory evidence as to the validity of the requested name. The main listing is ordinarily the name of the individual who subscribes for the service, but the listing may be in the name of a second party residing at the address where service is provided if so designated by the subscriber.

# A6.4 Non-Published (Private) Number

### A6.4.1 General

**A.** A non-published number is not listed in the Company's Listing Information System or directory assistance records and will not be furnished upon request of a calling party.

The omission of the listing at the customer's request does not entitle the customer to an additional listing without charge in connection with other services to which he may be subscribing

However, when a call is placed from a number associated with a non-published listing, the number may be disclosed, subject to technical limitations, if the called party has the necessary equipment for receiving and/or disclosing incoming numbers and/or names. The calling number and/or name will not be disclosed if the calling party blocks delivery via per-call blocking or if the calling line is equipped with per-line blocking.

- **B.** An incoming call to a subscriber with a non-published number will be completed by the Company only when the calling party places the call by number. The Company will adhere to this practice notwithstanding any claim of emergency the calling party may present. The acceptance by the Company of the subscriber's request to furnish a non-published number does not create any relationship or obligation, direct or indirect, to any person other than the subscriber.
- **C.** In the absence of gross negligence or willful misconduct, no liability for damages arising from disclosing said number to any persons shall attach to the Company. Where a non-published number is disclosed in the Company's Listing Information System, the Company's liability shall be limited to and satisfied by a refund of any monthly charges which the Company may have made for such listing. Under these conditions the Company will, at the subscriber's request, change the number at no charge to the subscriber. The subscriber indemnifies and saves the Company harmless against any and all claims for damages caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by the disclosing of said listing information to any person.
- **D.** The number, name and address of the calling party may be displayed at a Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) located on the premises of a customer subscribing to 911 Service, on a call-by-call basis only, for the purpose of responding to emergency calls from non-published numbers. The subscriber forfeits his right to privacy upon making a call to 911.
- **E.** For accounting purposes, the number, name, and address of a subscriber with a non-published number may be provided to the Long Distance Carrier(s) who furnishes the subscriber long distance message telecommunications service. Under no circumstance may this information be used by the Long Distance Carrier(s) for marketing purposes.
- **F.** Upon request, the Company may provide billing name and address information associated with a non-published number to interexchange carriers, unless the subscriber requests that the Company restrict this information from being released.
- **G.** The Company may provide number, name and address of a subscriber with a Non-Published number to the public safety agency certified, authorized and responsible for providing emergency notification services in the local city, county or municipality where the subscriber line associated with such number is located, pursuant to that agency's request under Emergency Service Provider Data Service (ESPDS) detailed in A38.4.

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# A6.5 Non-Listed (Semiprivate) Number

### A6.5.1 General

**A.** A non-listed number is excluded from other listing services but is maintained on directory assistance records and will be furnished upon the request of a calling party.

Further, when a call is placed from a telephone number associated with a Non-Listed Number, the number may be disclosed, subject to technical limitations, if the called party has the necessary equipment for receiving and/or disclosing incoming telephone numbers and/or names. The calling number and/or name will not be disclosed if the calling party blocks delivery via per-call blocking or if the calling line is equipped with per-line blocking.

- **B.** The acceptance by the Company of the subscriber's request to furnish a non-listed number does not create any relationship or obligation, direct or indirect, to any person other than the subscriber.
- **C.** In the absence of gross negligence or willful misconduct, no liability for damages arising from including a non-listed telephone number in other listing services shall attach to the Company. Where such a number is provided, the Company's liability shall be limited to and satisfied by a refund of any monthly charges which the Company may have made for such non-listed number. The subscriber indemnifies and saves the Company harmless against any and all claims for damages caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by providing a non-listed number.
- **D.** The telephone number, name and address of the calling party may be displayed at a Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), located on the premises of a customer subscribing to 911 Service on a call-by-call basis only for the purpose of responding to emergency calls from a non-listed number.
- **E.** For accounting purposes, the telephone number, name, and address of a subscriber with a non-listed number may be provided to the Long Distance Carrier(s) who furnishes the subscriber long distance message telecommunications service. Under no circumstance may this information be used by the Long Distance Carrier(s) for marketing purposes.
- **F.** Upon request, the Company may provide billing name and address information associated with a non-listed number to interexchange carriers or certain other providers of telecommunications services, unless the subscriber requests that the Company restrict this information from being released.
- **G.** The Company may provide number, name and address of a subscriber with a Non-Listed number to the public safety agency (M2) certified, authorized and responsible for providing emergency notification services in the local city, county or municipality where the subscriber line associated with such number is located, pursuant to that agency's request under Emergency Service Provider Data Service (ESPDS) detailed in A38.4.

  - 3. Changing an additional dual name listing to a primary dual name listing.

- B. A RingMaster service listing must be either business or residence as identified by the class of service.
- C. Other listings may be provided at the Rates, *Terms and Conditions* specified in this Guidebook.

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# **A8. TELEPHONE ANSWERING SERVICE FACILITIES**

### A8.1 General Provisions

#### **A8.1.1 Facilities and Equipment**

- **A.** The Company will provide facilities, as outlined herein, for telephone answering bureaus (secretarial firms) for their use in furnishing telephone answering service for subscribers to individual and 2-party line service, IMTS and two-way dial service of a miscellaneous common carrier when they are absent or do not desire to answer their calls personally.
- **B.** PBX (or similar system) main station business individual line and local private line terminations may also be provided where the subscriber contracts with a telephone answering bureau to receive all incoming calls or where the telephone answering bureau wishes to terminate administrative service for answering purposes only. Standard charges for these services are applicable.
- **C.** A concentrator-identifier is available for connecting a telephone answering bureau with secretarial lines or business individual lines of its clients located in central office areas other than that in which the telephone answering bureau is located.
- **D.** Local exchange trunks may be terminated in a telephone answering switchboard for the purpose of completing local or long distance calls.
- **E.** The telephone answering bureau may bridge calls from secretarial lines to the general exchange network over local exchange central office lines furnished the bureau for its administrative use; however, these facilities furnished by the Company are not designed for such call bridging. The telephone answering bureau bridges calls at its own risk and the Company will not be liable for defects in transmission or other service difficulties arising out of or resulting from this type connection. The service is not to be used to circumvent toll charges. Such usage is in direct violation of the intent of the service and is considered by the Company just cause to terminate the service after notice.

#### **A8.1.2 Serving Rearrangements**

- **A.** The existing charges for a customer's extension line mileage will continue in effect for twelve months when a change in the routing of facilities or other serving arrangements would result in the application of additional charges.
  - 1. The application of A applies when the change is required for reasons other than a customer's request.
  - 2. The twelve-month period will begin effective with the first month following the change or rearrangements where such changes result in the application of increased charges and the customer's notification in writing of the rearrangements.
  - 3. Customers will be notified thirty (30) days prior to new charges being applied.
- **B.** The existing charges for a customer's extension line mileage will be reduced in the first month effective with the change where such changes result in the application of lesser charges.

#### A8.2 Rates and Charges

Telephone answering service facilities are billed at the rates and charges indicated herein to the telephone answering bureau with the exception of the facilities outlined in A8.2.4 which are billed to the client of the telephone answering bureau.

### A8.2.1 Central Office Lines and Stations for Administrative Use

- **A.** Associated with key equipment and switchboards not arranged for making connections to administrative station lines.
  - 1. Rates and charges for Business Individual Lines, Extension Service (A13) rates and charges apply for additional terminations.

### A8.3 Central Office Concentrator Service

#### A8.3.1 General

- A. Central Office Concentrator Service is available to any subscriber who has a need for concentration of incoming calls to clients' Central Office exchange lines. The service is provided by the Company through the use of concentrator(s) located in the Company's Central Office. The concentrator(s) concentrates incoming calls to some number of client lines to some smaller number of trunks/channels connected to the subscriber's premises equipment.<sup>2</sup>
- B. Central Office Concentrator Service, upon detecting a ringing signal to the client's line, will immediately process the call, with unique identification, to the subscriber's premises equipment. A variable ring count feature whereby the client's ring count can be changed from the subscriber premises is also provided. The signaling arrangement employed in processing the call from the concentrator to the subscriber's premises equipment is standard Direct Inward Dialing (DID) type signaling.
- C. Central Office Concentrator Service can be used with either compatible Company-provided or customer-provided equipment (M2) located on the subscriber's premises.
  - **Note 1:** Where the secretarial line is bridged in the central office this charge does not apply in (T) connection with a main station change of address within the same wire center area.
  - **Note 2:** "Subscriber" as used in this Section refers to the Company customer. "Client" as used in this (T) Section refers to the customer of the Company's subscriber.

#### A8.3.2 Terms and Conditions

- **A.** Channels connecting the concentrator with the subscriber's premises shall be provided at rates applicable to concentrator-identifier services, as specified in A8.2.2.A.
- **B.** Client line terminations on the concentrator (billed to the client) shall be provided at rates shown for Secretarial line terminations.
- C. Central Office Concentrator Service is designed to work with all premises equipment which is capable of receiving standard DID type signaling. However the Company does not guarantee the compatibility of Central Office Concentrator Service with any particular manufacturer's premises equipment.

#### A8.3.3 Central Office Concentrator Service - Type A

- A. Description of Service Elements
  - 1. Master Concentrator The Master Concentrator provides for up to 256 client line terminations and 16 outgoing trunks/channels to the subscriber's premises.
  - 2. Slave Concentrator Slave Concentrators must be located in the same Central Office as the host Master Concentrator. Up to 2 Slave Concentrators can be connected to a Master Concentrator.

Each Slave Concentrator provides for up to 256 additional client line terminations. When a Master Concentrator and 2 Slave Concentrators are employed, there is a capacity for 768 client line terminations and 16 outgoing trunk/channel terminations.

- 3. Concentrator Line Card The Concentrator Line Card provides for connection of up to 32 client lines to the concentrator/matrix switch. Eight of these cards may be connected for a single 256 line concentrator assembly. This card is used in both the Master and Slave Concentrators.
- 4. Client Line Control Client Line Control provides capability for the concentrator to transfer control of a completed call from the answering service attendant back to the client (originally called party) if the client goes off-hook, thus eliminating any possible interference between the answering service attendant and the client.

Variable Ring Count is also provided as a feature which allows the client's line to be answered immediately or after three or five rings; selection is also provided for no-answer. The no-answer alternative would be employed for non-24 hour customers and would effectively deactivate service as desired. Also required for operation with each Master Concentrator, when using the variable ring count feature, are 108 type data sets and a 300 or 1200 baud channel.

### A8.3.3 Central Office Concentrator Service - Type A (Cont'd)

- **B.** Payment Option Plan
  - 1. Central Office Concentrator Service Type A is offered under the Variable Term Payment Plan (VTPP) as described in (M1)(T) Section A22, except as specified in 2.
  - 2. Options and Conditions Under VTPP
    - a. Customers may select one of three payment periods 1 month, 48 months, or 72 months. A different rate applies for (M1) each payment period.
    - b. VTPP provisions relating to moves within a jurisdiction and to moves between jurisdictions do apply. Moves however must be out of service moves and must recover all applicable costs.
    - c. A customer converting from Two-Tier AUTOTAS<sup>®</sup> concentrator service to Central Office Concentrator Service -Type A may do so subject to the following conditions.
      - (1) Any specific non-recurring charges which were deferred under the Two-Tier Payment Plan must be paid before the customer is eligible for transition.
      - (2) The customer's entire concentrator service at a given Central Office location must be converted to VTPP at monthly rates specified in A8.3.3.C. Entire concentrator service includes a Master Concentrator, plus any associated Slave Concentrators, Concentrator Line Cards, and Client Control Circuits.
      - (3) Remaining Two-Tier Basic (Tier A) charges do not apply to equipment which is converted to Central Office Concentrator Service - Type A provided the customer elects a VTPP period of longer than one month.
      - (4) A one-time charge for conversion from AUTOTAS<sup>®</sup> concentrator service provided under the Two-Tier payment plan to Central Office Concentrator Service Type A is applicable as shown in Section A8.3.3.C.

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# A9. FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE AND FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE SERVICE

### A9.1 Foreign Exchange Service

#### **A9.1.1** Terms and Conditions

(T)

- **A.** Foreign exchange service is exchange service furnished to a subscriber from an exchange other than the one from which he would normally be served. This service may only be provided where all facilities and serving points are located in the same LATA.
- **B.** Foreign exchange service is offered in connection with flat rate or Community Caller Plus individual line service, flat rate or Community Caller Plus PBX service, flat rate or Community Caller Plus network access registers and flat rate or Community Caller Plus Centrex Type Services only.
- C. Other services, equipment or facilities used in connection with foreign exchange service, except as otherwise indicated in this *Guidebook*, are furnished subject to the Rates, *Terms and Conditions* applying in the foreign exchange from which the subscriber is served.
  (T)
- **D.** Foreign exchange service is furnished subject to the same restriction as to the use of the service by other than the subscriber and his representatives, as apply in connection with other classes of service.
- E. Subscribers to foreign exchange service are not required to subscribe to other service in the exchange from which they would normally be served.
- **F.** Where the serving foreign exchange is a multi-office exchange, foreign exchange service will be provided from whichever central office would be most economical to the Company; if an applicant desires operation from a different central office and facilities are available therefore, foreign central office charges as per A9.2 will apply for the channel required between the Company selected central office and the central office from which the applicant desires to be served.
- G. Allowance for Interruptions for Foreign Exchange Service
  - 1. For the access line services described in B, the *Terms and Conditions* for interruption of service in A2.4.4 will apply .
  - 2. For the interexchange channel portion of the Foreign Exchange Service, the *Terms and Conditions* for interruption of service as shown in the Private Line *Guidebook* will apply.

Long Distance Message Telecommunications service furnished at a customer's request when his foreign exchange service is interrupted, is charged at Long Distance Message Telephone *service* rates.

- **H.** All negotiations for the establishment of foreign exchange service will be initiated by the prospective subscriber with the Company having the exchange from which he normally would be served.
- I. Resale of Foreign Exchange Service is provided to certified long distance carriers through the use of Feature Group A, Switched Access Service from the Access Service Tariff.

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# A9. FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE AND FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE SERVICE

### A9.1 Foreign Exchange Service (Cont'd)

### A9.1.1 Terms and Conditions (Cont'd)

*J.* Foreign exchange service to an Extended Area Service group of exchanges or to a Metropolitan Service Area will normally be provided from the principal exchange(s) or switching center(s) of that group or area. However, upon customer insistence Foreign Exchange service may be provided from any exchange in the state to any other exchange in the state in accordance with 1 and 2. Interexchange channel (IXC) mileage charges and channel terminal charges as specified in A9.1.3 depend upon the distance between rate centers.<sup>1</sup>

The rate centers between which the mileage is measured depend in some cases upon the principal exchange or switching (M1) center designated for the foreign exchange. The various cases and the distances for which the mileage charges and channel terminal charges are applicable are specified following. The foreign exchange is the exchange from which dial tone is provided. The home exchange is the exchange in which the subscriber is located.

#### Service Desired

- 1. Between exchanges within the same EAS Group:<sup>2</sup>
  - a. The calling scope of the home exchange includes as a minimum all exchanges in the calling scope of the foreign exchange.
  - b. The calling scope of the home exchange does not include all the exchanges in the calling scope of the foreign exchange and:
    - The foreign exchange is its own principal switching center or has only one principal switching center or
    - (2) The foreign exchange has two principal switching centers.

#### 2. Between exchanges not within the same EAS Group:

- a. The foreign exchange is its own principal switching center or has only one principal switching center.
- b. The foreign exchange has two principal switching centers.

IXC Mileage Charges apply for the distance between:

The foreign exchange and the home exchange.

The home exchange and the principal switching center plus the distance (if any) between the foreign exchange and the principal switching center.

The foreign exchange and the home exchange plus the distance to the principal switching center which is not associated with the home exchange.

The home exchange and the principal switching center plus the distance (if any) between the foreign exchange and the principal switching center.

The home exchange and the nearest principal switching center plus the distance from the nearest principal switching center to the foreign exchange plus the distance from the foreign exchange to the second principal switching center.

Services established to Extended Area Service points on or before November 10, 1966, will be continued at the same address (M2) for the same customer under the *Terms and Conditions* existing prior to November 10, 1966, until such services are discontinued or otherwise replaced.

Services established to Non-Extended Area Service points as well as those established under existing *Terms and Conditions* (T)(M2) which would be altered by the introduction of new or enlarged Extended Area Service plans will be continued under *Terms and Conditions* in effect at the time of establishment of service until such time as discontinued or otherwise replaced. For purposes of this *Conditions*, the effective date of the introduction of new enlarged Extended Area Service plans will be the date on which formal approval to establish the service is given.

- **Note 1:** No rates or charges other than the interexchange channel charge and channel terminal charge are affected by principal switching center provisions. The channel terminal charge is affected only to the extent that the distance determined by the provisions dictates which charge to apply, i.e., \$26.65 or \$36.70.
- **Note 2:** For the purposes of this provision two exchanges are considered to be in the same EAS group if the calling scope of each exchange includes the other exchange.

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4. Foreign Exchange Service is normally furnished on a single point basis. However, where facilities permit, Multipoint service may be provided within the same LATA. Rates and charges are as specified in A9.1.3.A, plus those charges for multipoint bridging as specified herein. The first customer location in a foreign exchange is to be designated as the Type 2006 station terminal. Each additional customer premises served in the same exchange and/or different exchange as the Type 2006 station terminal and/or other exchange providing the foreign exchange service (dial tone) is to be designated a Type 2010 station terminal. Interexchange mileage charges for multipoint service is that combination of airline distance connecting rate center points which will produce the lowest total interexchange mileage charge. Each channel connected to an interexchange switching arrangement is considered a separate channel for which the mileage is independently computed.

Where bridging is provided at the "open end" (dial tone end) of Foreign Exchange Service, then a bridging charge is also applicable for connection of the bridge to local switching equipment that provides access to the public switched network. This is in addition to bridging charges for each of the Type 2006 and 2010 channel links bridged at that location. The switched network bridged connection is to be treated and charged as an interexchange channel connection to a bridge.

Standard quality of transmission levels is assured on multipoint Foreign Exchange Service. This provision does not extend to multi-station bridging on a customer's premises unless multi-station bridging is also provided at the same charges as for Type 2001 Station Terminals.

10. Four Wire Service Terminating Arrangement

The Four Wire Service Terminating Arrangement permits switching equipment that is designed to use four wire terminations to be connected to the Company's standard two wire Foreign Exchange (FX) exchange facilities toll network. While this offering contemplates the use of four wire facilities, between the local serving Central Office and the premises switching equipment, two wire facilities may be used. Transmission performance that meets the established standards of the Company will be obtained over facilities connected to a Four Wire Service Terminating Arrangement. If a customer requests improvement beyond this, additional equipment will be provided, where facility conditions permit, subject to additional rates and charges based on the costs incurred.

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### **A9.2 Foreign Central Office Service**

#### **A9.2.1** Terms and Conditions

- **A.** Foreign central office service is exchange service furnished to a subscriber in a multi-office exchange from a central office other than the one from which service would normally be furnished.
- B. Foreign central office service is offered in connection with individual line main station service and PBX service only.
- C. Other services, equipment or facilities used in connection with foreign central office service, except as otherwise indicated in this *Guidebook*, are furnished subject to the Rates, *Terms and Conditions* applying in the foreign central office from which the subscriber is served.
- **D.** No allowance is made for interruptions of less than twenty-four hours. For interruptions of twenty-four hours or more, credit is allowed for the proportionate part of the monthly charge in multiples of one day for each twenty-four hours or major fraction thereof, of interruption for the portion of the facilities rendered inoperative by reason of the interruption.

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### A11. PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SERVICE

#### A11.1 General

#### A11.1.1 General Terms and Conditions

- **A.** Private Branch Exchange service, commonly known as PBX service, provides an arrangement of switching equipment and stations for intercommunicating among the stations and for connections through the local and long distance telephone network to other subscribers.
- **B.** Except as provided hereinafter, flat rate trunks are offered to both business and residence subscribers. Message rate trunks are offered to business subscribers only at those exchanges quoting business individual line message rates and for hospital and retirement center service at all exchanges. Message rate PBX service is not offered for residence or Centralized Incoming PBX Service (obsolete).
- C. Hotel PBX service is the only class of service available to hotels, motels, tourist courts and time-share or condominium complexes serving primarily transient tenants for the joint use of the management and guests. It is also available for use of tenants of apartment units in hotels and hotel-apartments. The management may subscribe for separate business service for its administrative use. Guests may individually subscribe to separate residence service.

Hotel PBX service is available in connection with certain types of dial as well as manual systems. Dial systems are furnished on a measured basis where facilities are available or message rate otherwise, or on a combination arrangement providing for administrative use on a flat rate basis and guests' use on a measured basis where facilities are available or message rate otherwise. Access to flat rate trunks from the measured or message rate stations furnished in guests' rooms is not permissible with the combination arrangement. Manual installations are made only on a measured basis where facilities are available or message rate otherwise.

- **D.** Hospital PBX service is furnished for the joint use of management and patients of hospitals on either a regular business flat or message rate basis, or on a combination flat and message rate basis. With certain types of dial systems, a combination arrangement is available providing for administrative use on a flat rate basis and patients' use on a message rate basis. This arrangement does not permit outgoing calls access to flat rate trunks from the message rate stations in patients' rooms. However, hospitals may have flat rate service in patients' rooms as well as flat rate service for their administrative use where it can be provisioned.
- E. Retirement Center PBX service is furnished for the joint use of management and retirees of licensed retirement centers on either a regular business flat or message rate basis, or on a combination flat and message rate basis. With certain types of dial PBX systems, a combination arrangement is available providing for administrative use on a flat rate basis and retirees' use on a message rate basis. This arrangement does not permit access to flat rate trunks from the message rate stations in the retirees' rooms. Retirees may individually subscribe to separate residence service.
- **F.** The rates specified hereinafter apply for PBX station lines located on the same premises and in the same building as the switchboard. For station lines not so located, extension line charges shall apply as specified in Section A13.
