4.2 EXCHANGE LINES AND USAGE

4.2.3 PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TRUNKS

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Private Branch Exchange Trunks are no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

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A. DESCRIPTION

Private Branch Exchange (PBX) trunk lines provide a telecommunications channel between the customer's premises and the Company's central office (CO). The channel connects PBX stations to the telecommunications network.

B. REGULATIONS

1. PBX service will be provided outside the base rate area or special rate area and within the exchange area at the rates listed in this tariff.
2. Service under this Guidebook will be provided outside the exchange area according to rates and regulations listed in Part 15, Section 2 of this Guidebook, or Part 4, Section 5 of this Guidebook for Mileage Charges.
3. The toll rates applicable to toll service in connection with foreign exchange service will be according to the toll tariff provisions of the foreign exchange.
4. Lines and/or stations are installed on the premises on which the PBX switchboard or subsidiary PBX is located. Rates as specified in Part 4, Section 5 apply to off-premises mileage.

4.2.3 PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TRUNKS (Cont'd)

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Private Branch Exchange Trunks are no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

5.1. CENTREX SERVICE (CS)

5.1.1 DIGITAL CENTREX SERVICE

A. DESCRIPTION

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Digital Centrex Service is no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

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Effective September 30, 2024, customers may not establish new term plans greater than 12 months for Centrex service, and existing term plans greater than 12 months may not be renewed or extended for a term greater than 12 months. Effective September 30, 2024, the Company will renew Centrex term payment plans only for additional 12-month terms by written amendment. If a 12-month term is not signed upon expiration of the term, the month-to-month rate listed in the Guidebook will apply.

Digital Centrex Service (DCS) is a flat rate business service with regulations, features, descriptions, and rates and charges described in this section. DCS is a central office based Touch-Tone service provided from suitably equipped digital central office facilities and where operating conditions permit.

B. REGULATIONS

1. The Company reserves the right to approve any service request.
2. Some standard and optional features may not be available in any given location, depending on the central office technology being deployed.
3. A customer's primary location must be served by a digital central office to be under the jurisdiction of this service offering. Those DCS customers whose primary location is digitally served and who also have Centrex systems in other non-digital central offices of the Company may utilize the DCS service offering for all of their Centrex services.
4. This section applies to the Digital Centrex Service general offering only. DCS is considered to be a system offering. No equivalent DCS rate element from this section may be utilized for other guidebook, tariffed or contracted exchange services with the following exception: other Centrex or DCS contractual agreements may utilize the rate elements herein described only for features and functions not available in their service agreements with the Company if available.
5. All telephones, consoles, or any terminal devices residing on the customer's premise shall be provided by the customer.
6. Any tie line, mileage, wiring or other system or station feature or functionality that may be required for DCS Service that is not specified in this section may be acquired pursuant to other Centrex service offerings, existing Guidebook provisions or F.C.C. tariffs, or in the absence of appropriate pricing jurisdiction, by contractual agreement (if offered).

5.1. CENTREX SERVICE (CS)

5.1.1 DIGITAL CENTREX SERVICE (Cont.)

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Digital Centrex Service is no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

5.2 OTHER CENTREX SERVICES

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Centrex Services are no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

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5.2.1 Integrated Service Digital Network

A. Description

1. Integrated Services Digital Network (ISDN)^{1,2/} is an architecture that will allow Centrex users to access voice, data and test/image services without the need for separate customer access lines. ISDN is a group of line and system wide features that can be provided in addition to existing Centrex features, where central office facilities and operating conditions permit.
2. ISDN provides an integrated voice/data communications capability for the transmission of circuit switched voice, circuit switched data, and packet switched data on an incoming and outgoing basis over Centrex Primary and Semi-Restricted Lines utilizing Integrated Services Digital Network (ISDN) architecture. The B channels are used for voice, packet, or circuit switched data at 64 Kbps. The D channel is used to carry signaling information for the B channels plus packet switched data. The service is available from specially equipped digital switching equipment located in the Company's central offices.
3. Circuit Switched Voice provides the ability to originate and receive voice switched calls over a 64 Kbps channel.
4. Circuit Switched Data provides the ability to originate and receive switched data calls over the 64 Kbps channel. Data line speeds up to 64 Kbps are permitted.
5. Packet Data is available on the "D" channel at 16 Kbps, and optionally on the "B" channel at 64 Kbps.
6. ISDN will provide the customer with the ability to integrate current voice and data channel services over the existing Centrex local loop.

B. Regulations

1. The Company reserves the right to approve any service request.
2. Some standard and optional features may not be available in any given location, depending on the central office technology being deployed.

Note 1: Effective February 15, 2005, the Company grandfathered packet switching capability, in the Integrated Services Digital Network option of Centrex Services. No new customers will be added after that date. In addition, services will be limited to existing service and quantities at existing locations. All existing rates and regulations will continue to apply. On July 1, 2005, or when all customers have ceased subscribing to the service, whichever occurs first, packet switching capability, in the Integrated Services Digital Network will be withdrawn.

Note 2: Effective September 30, 2024, customers may not establish new term plans greater than 12 months for Centrex service, and existing term plans greater than 12 months may not be renewed or extended for a term greater than 12 months. Effective September 30, 2024, the Company will renew Centrex term payment plans only for additional 12-month terms by written amendment. If a 12-month term is not signed upon expiration of the term, the month-to-month rate listed in the Guidebook will apply.

5.2 OTHER CENTREX SERVICES

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Centrex Services are no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

7.4 REMOTE CALL FORWARDING

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Remote Call Forwarding for business is no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

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7.4.1. REMOTE CALL FORWARDING

A. DESCRIPTION

1. This service provides for automatic routing of calls to a Remote Call Forwarding telephone number to another telephone number in a distant exchange.

B. REGULATIONS

1. Remote Call Forwarding Service

- a. Does not include telephone set in the exchange in which the service is located.
- b. May be provided with local or foreign exchange service, individual line or trunk service, as an auxiliary hunting terminal to forward calls that result from an all lines busy condition or for a night transfer arrangement.
- c. Is restricted from forwarding calls to the following services:
 - Coin Service
 - Access Services (including Feature Groups A, B, C, or D) unless otherwise specified in the access tariff
 - 700 numbers listed and billed to an interexchange carrier
 - International telephone numbers
 - Numbers associated with N11 services (e.g., 911, 411, 511, 211)
 - Other Remote Call Forwarding numbers
- d. May be provided with 800 service.
- e. Is available in all exchanges served by an electronic switching system central office where facilities and operating conditions permit.
- f. Is subject to transmission limitations, so that the quality of transmission of calls which are forwarded may vary depending on the distance and the routing necessary to complete each call and normal transmission is not guaranteed on any forwarded call. This service is not represented as being suitable for the transmission of data or for connection to other services beyond the premises of the terminating primary station.
- g. Is furnished for a minimum period of two months.

7.4 REMOTE CALL FORWARDING

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Remote Call Forwarding for business is no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

17.2 ISDN PRIMARY RATE INTERFACE (PRI)

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, ISDN Primary Rate Interface (PRI) is no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

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17.2.1. PRI Service

A. DESCRIPTION

1. Primary Rate Integrated Services Digital Network (ISDN) "PRI" service allows customers to connect suitably equipped ISDN customer premises equipment (CPE) to the Utility's Central Office switch using PRI interfaces as set forth in Service Feature Definitions, following, over a utility provided digital transport facility using interface specifications described in Lucent Technologies documents 5D5-900-302, 312, 322, 332 and 342, PUB 41449 and PUB41459; Northern Telecom document NIS A211-2; Telcordia TR-TSY-000499 and SR-TSY-000977; or subsequent revisions.
2. The digital transport facility may be, but is not limited to, DS1 or DS3 level, and is to be provided under appropriate Company Tariffs P.U.C.N. No's. C7.12., and/or FCC No. 1 Section 7.11 for carriers, and Nevada Catalog – Guidebook Part 15, Section 3 and/or Part 17, Section 2. The digital transport facility and PRI interface (package) must be billed to the same customer of record
3. Each connection of a 24 channel digital transport facility to the Central Office switch provides one PRI interface as set forth in Service Feature Definitions, Interfaces, following.
4. One or more PRI interfaces can be combined to create a PRI serving arrangement. With each PRI serving arrangement, customers may subscribe to PRI Optional Features and Associated Services as set forth in Service Feature Definitions, following.
5. A PRI network serving arrangement is created when a Centrex connects to a PRI serving arrangement, and/or one or more PRI serving arrangements are connected to form a network. A PRI network serving arrangement requires application of the PRI network establishment feature (PRI-NET) as set forth in Service Feature Definitions, following.

The following entities may be included in, but not limited to, a PRI serving arrangement and/or network serving arrangement:

- ISDN capable PBX
 - Centrex residing in PRI serving Central Office switch
 - Other suitably equipped ISDN customer premises equipment (CPE)
 - Interexchange Carrier Point of Presence (IEC POP)
6. Blocked Caller ID will be delivered to certain qualifying customers as described in FCC Memorandum Opinion and Order, CC Docket No. 91-281 adopted January 4, 2002. Such customers must certify compliance with the company.

17.2 ISDN PRIMARY RATE INTERFACE (PRI)

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, ISDN Primary Rate Interface (PRI) is no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued. (N)

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective February 23, 2026, Remote Call Forwarding for business described in Part 7, Section 4 of this Guidebook is no longer available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly rates until the service is discontinued.

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BASIC RATE INTERFACE ISDN (BRI)

Service Availability

Except as otherwise indicated for Wire Centers in Part 2, Section 2.2.2.1 A.5., effective September 1, 2021, (C) Basic Rate Interface ISDN (BRI) currently found in Part 17, Section 1 of this Guidebook will no longer be available for purchase by new or existing customers. In addition, requests to move, add, change, or renew existing service arrangements will not be accepted. The Company will continue to provide existing service to existing customers until the expiration of a customer's term agreement. Following the expiration of a customer's existing term agreement, service will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the applicable Monthly Extension rates until the service is discontinued. The Company currently plans to discontinue this service on or after August 1, 2023.
