### 1.1 **Preliminary Statement**

Services offered in California by the Company, with principal offices at 5130 Hacienda Drive, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Dallas, Texas 75202 94568, are now offered on a detariffed basis pursuant to California Public Utilities Commission Decision No. 07-09-018, which requires that certain basic terms and conditions remain tariffed. Services are available twenty-four (24) hours a day, 365 days a year.

The Company shall not be deemed to have waived or impaired any right, power, requirement or option reserved by this Tariff (including, without limitation, the right to demand exact compliance with every term and condition herein), by virtue of any custom or practice of the Company at variance with the terms hereof, or any failure, refusal or neglect of the Company to exercise any right under this Tariff or to insist upon exact compliance with its terms, or any waiver, forbearance, delay, failure or omission by the Company to exercise any right, power or option hereunder.

The contents of this Tariff maintain rules that are specific to Company's California intrastate Services, in addition to those maintained in the California Data Guidebook. To the extent there is any conflict between the terms and conditions of this tariff and the terms and conditions of the California Data Guidebook, the terms and conditions of the tariff govern.

- (C) -To signify changed listing, rule, or condition which may affect a rate, charge, term, or condition;.

- (L) -To signify material relocated from or to another part of tariff schedules with no change in text;
- (N) -To signify new material including a listing, rate, charge, rule or condition;
- (P) -To signify material subject to change under a pending application or advise letter;
- (R) -To signify a rate or charge reduction;
- (T) -To signify textual change that does not affect a rate, charge, term, or condition; and

#### 1.3 **Tariff Format**

- 1.3.1 Sheet Numbering - Sheet numbers appear in the upper right corner of the sheet. Sheets are numbered sequentially. However, new sheets are added to the Tariff from time to time. When a new sheet is added between sheets already in effect, a decimal is added. For example, a new sheet added between sheets 14 and 15 would be 14.1.
- 1.3.2 Sheet Revision Numbers - Revision numbers also appear in the upper right corner of each sheet. These numbers are used to determine the most current sheet version on file with the Commission. For example, the 4th revised sheet 14 cancels the 3rd revised sheet 14.
- 1.3.3 Paragraph Numbering Sequence - There are seven levels of paragraph coding. Each level of coding is subservient to its next higher level:

1.3.4 Check Sheets - When a Tariff filing is made with the Commission, an updated check sheet accompanies the Tariff filing. The check sheet lists the sheets contained in the Tariff with a crossreference to the current revision number. When new sheets are added, the check sheet is changed to reflect the revision.
