The following are the only symbols used for the purposes indicated below:

- D - Deleted Material
- I - Change In Rates Or Change Resulting In An Increase To A Customer's Bill
- M - Moved To Or From Another Tariff Location
- N - New Material.
- R - Change In Rates Or Change Resulting In A Reduction To A Customer's Bill
- T - Change In Text Or Regulation But No Change In Rate Or Charge

TARIFF FORMAT

- A. Page Numbering - Page numbers appear in the upper right corner of the page. Pages are numbered sequentially. However, new pages are added to the Tariff from time to time. When a new page is added between pages already in effect, a decimal is added. For example, a new page added between pages 14 and 15 would be 14.1.
- B. Page Revision Numbers - Revision numbers also appear in the upper right corner of each page. These numbers are used to determine the most current page version on file with the Commission. For example, the 4th revised page 14 cancels the 3rd revised page 14. Consult the Check Page currently in effect to determine the version currently in effect.
- C. Paragraph Numbering Sequence - There are six levels of paragraph coding. Each level of coding is subservient to its next higher level:
 - 2.1
 - 2.1.1
 - 2.1.1 (A)
 - 2.1.1 (A).1
 - 2.1.1 (A).1.a
 - 2.1.1 (A).1.a.i
- D. Check Pages - When a Tariff filing is made with the Commission, an updated check page accompanies the Tariff filing. The check page lists the pages contained in the Tariff with a cross-reference to the current revision number. When new pages are added, the check page is changed to reflect the revision.
