Footnotes

- {1} The local message allowance is 100 outgoing local messages, and \$0.08 for each additional outgoing local message over 100. One-Element Measured 1-Party business service is offered only to customers located within SWBT's Texas exchange central offices which have both the capability and capacity to offer such service.
- {2} Includes SWBT-provided coin collecting station.
- {3} In addition, a charge of \$0.06 per outgoing local message applies.
- {4} Hotel/Motel customers have the option of subscribing to Hotel/Motel Measured Trunks (THB) or PBX Trunks (TFB) for their guests' use; however, the mixing of flat and measured trunks for guests' use shall not be permitted.
- {5} Applicable to only those "grandfathered customers" (customers with existing service at the same premises and under existing billing name) who previously had Suburban 4-Party Service and were converted to 1-Party Service at the time their respective exchange eliminated Suburban 4-Party Service as an offering.
- {6} The priority provisioning and restoration of services offered under this tariff relative to the National Security Emergency Preparedness (NSEP) Telecommunications Service Priority (TSP) System shall be pursuant to the regulations and rates as delineated in the Telecommunications Service Priority System Tariff.  
  
For application in this tariff, such regulations, rates and charges as are described in the Telecommunications Service Priority System Tariff shall be interpreted to apply on a "per request, per line/trunk" basis.
- {7} See Paragraph 3.1.3 for rules and regulations associated with the Reserve Line option. In addition to the monthly rate per exchange access line (USOC 12L) listed in Paragraph 3.1.2, customers who choose the Reserve Line option are charged the following:
