2.1 VoIP-PSTN Traffic

This section applies to VoIP-PSTN traffic exchanged between the Telephone Company and the customer in time division multiplexing ("TDM") format that originates and/or terminates in Internet protocol ("IP") format. VoIP-PSTN traffic originates and/or terminates in IP format if it originates from and/or terminates to an end-user customer of a service that requires Internet protocol-compatible customer premises equipment. The transitional Intercarrier Compensation framework for VoIP-PSTN traffic adopted by the Federal Communications Commission in its Report and Order, Release No. 11-161 (Nov. 18, 2011) ("FCC Order") directed that this intrastate VoIP-PSTN traffic be billed employing interstate rates.^{/1/}

The intrastate switched access rates in this tariff are the same as the interstate rates for Switched Access rate elements. Thus, no modifications to the rates and/or billing are necessary as a result of the VoIP-PSTN provisions of the FCC Order.

2.2 Except as otherwise provided below, regulations in Section 2 of the Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 relevant to intrastate service provided in the state of Wisconsin apply to service provided under this tariff.

2.3 Local Exchange Toll Provider Exceptions

With respect to ordering rating and billing of Access Services where more than one exchange telephone company is involved, where Switched Access Services are provided to a local exchange carrier that is providing IntraLATA switched service as an interexchange carrier and all or a portion of the Access Service is provided by a local exchange company associated with Wisconsin Bell, LLC for purposes of provision of switched access, such Access Service will be rated and billed by Wisconsin Bell, LLC under the terms of this tariff. Arrangements for any facilities required in connection with provision of the switched access will be made by Wisconsin Bell, LLC.

Where Special Access Services are provided to a local exchange carrier that is providing IntraLATA interexchange Private Line Service as an interexchange carrier and a portion of the Access Service to the point of meeting with the interexchange carrier is provided by a local exchange company other than Wisconsin Bell, LLC, such Access Service is provided in accordance with the regulations governing ordering, rating and billing of Access Service where more than one exchange telephone company is involved, as found in Section 2.4.7 of Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 2.

2.4 UNE to Access Conversions

The UNE to access conversions language found in F.C.C. No. 2, Section 2.1.1 only applies to UNE to interstate access conversions.

/1/ Although the Telephone Company has taken the position that this tariff, by its own terms, already applies to VoIP-PSTN traffic, as defined herein, the Telephone Company has included this Section in the tariff out of an abundance of caution to prevent any claim that it does not so apply, and to implement the decision by the Federal Communications Commission in its Report and Order in WC Docket Nos. 10-90, etc., FCC Release No. 11-161 (Nov. 18, 2011) ("FCC Order") that VoIP-PSTN access traffic should be exchanged at interstate access rates (unless the parties have agreed otherwise). By its terms, the FCC Order is prospective only, and does not address preexisting law with regard to the applicability of intercarrier compensation or the enhanced service providers ("ESP") exemption to VoIP-PSTN Traffic. Including this section in the tariff in no way alters or otherwise affects the applicability of this tariff to VoIP-PSTN Traffic before the effective date of the FCC Order.

3 CARRIER COMMON LINE ACCESS SERVICE

3.1 Except as otherwise provided below, regulations in Section 3 of the Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 relevant to intrastate service provided in the state of Wisconsin apply to service provided under this tariff.

3.2 Local Exchange Toll Provider Exceptions

In addition to the application described in the above referenced tariff, Carrier Common Line Access also provides for the use of common lines of local exchange companies other than the Telephone Company where the local exchange company is associated with Wisconsin Bell, LLC for purposes of providing switched access to a local exchange company providing intraLATA services as an interexchange carrier. Where the customer is provided use of the common lines as described above, rates and charges will be the equivalent of the local exchange company operating the exchange at which the access is provided.

3.3 Rates and Charges

3.3.1 Rates for Carrier Common Line Access contained in Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 are not applicable to service provided under this tariff.

3.4 Assessment of the PICC

If the end user line is not presubscribed to a primary interexchange carrier, the PICC will not apply. If the local exchange service is provided on a resold basis by a telecommunications carrier other than the Telephone Company, and the end user has not chosen a presubscribed interexchange carrier, the reseller will be assessed the PICC.

4.2 End User Common Line (EUCL) Exclusion

End User Common Line (EUCL) charges do not apply to intrastate exchange access service.

4.3 IntraLATA Presubscription

(A) General

IntraLATA Presubscription is a procedure whereby a subscriber designates to the Telephone Company the carrier which the subscriber wishes to be the carrier of choice for calls subject to IntraLATA Presubscription, as described in (B) following. Such calls are automatically directed to the designated carrier, without any specific codes or number being dialed or pulsed by the subscriber.

IntraLATA Presubscription does not apply in exchanges where the Telephone Company is the toll provider but not the dial tone provider in the Wisconsin portion of the Duluth, MN exchange where the Telephone Company does not provide the local switching facilities used to serve subscribers.

4.3 IntraLATA Presubscription (cont'd)

(B) Calls Subject to IntraLATA Presubscription

The following calls ("usage calls") are subject to IntraLATA Presubscription:

1. All IntraLATA message toll calls which are or would otherwise be governed by the provisions of the Telephone Company's Tariff P.S.C. of W. No. 20, Part 9, Section 1.
2. All calls to Milwaukee Metro Area exchanges originated by customers subscribing to One Way Optional Service to Milwaukee Metro Area Service which are billed as local calls are excluded.

(C) Calls Specifically Excluded from IntraLATA Presubscription

All 0- calls, calls to 411, 611, 911, Public Announcement Service calls (976-XXXX), and all local calls except as noted in (B)(2) preceding, including Extended Community Calling (ECC) calls, are specifically excluded from IntraLATA Presubscription.

Calls using the 500, 700, 800, or 900 service access codes shall be routed in accordance with the North American Numbering Plan.

(D) IntraLATA Presubscription Options

Option A - Subscriber selects the Telephone Company as the subscribed carrier for all IntraLATA usage calls subject to IntraLATA Presubscription and a carrier other than the Telephone Company as the subscribed carrier for all InterLATA usage calls.

Option B - Subscriber selects a single carrier as the subscribed carrier for all IntraLATA usage calls subject to IntraLATA Presubscription and InterLATA usage calls.

Option C - Subscriber selects a carrier other than the Telephone Company as the subscribed carrier for IntraLATA usage calls subject to IntraLATA Presubscription and a different carrier as the subscribed carrier for all InterLATA usage calls.

Option D - Subscriber selects no carrier for Intra and/or InterLATA usage calls.

4.3 IntraLATA Presubscription (cont'd)

(E) Rules and Regulations

Subscribers of record on the effective date of this tariff will retain their current dialing arrangements until they request that they be changed.

Subscribers of record or new subscribers may select either Options A, B, C, or D as their IntraLATA Presubscription choice.

Subscribers may change their selected option at any time subject to charges specified in (F) following.

(F) IntraLATA Presubscription Charges

(1) Application of Charges

New subscribers will be asked to select a carrier(s) at the time they place an order with the Telephone Company for a Telephone Company Network Access Line (see P.S.C. of W. No. 20, Part 2, Sections 1, for the definition of Network Access Line). If unable to make a selection at the time they place an order for the Telephone Company Network Access Line, new subscribers will be sent a listing of carriers to aid in their selection.

After the subscriber's initial selection, for any change thereafter, an IntraLATA Presubscription Charge, as set forth in (F)(2) following, applies.

A non-recurring charge, as set forth in (F)(2) following, to process a change in Presubscription is bifurcated into two (2) separate nonrecurring charges and applies as follows:

- (a) A nonrecurring charge applies when the request to change Presubscription is submitted through mechanized methods.
- (b) A nonrecurring charge applies when the request to change Presubscription is submitted through manual methods.

As used above, manual methods are (i) personal interaction between an end user or agent, and a Telephone Company employee; and (ii) any written submission from an end user or agent to a Telephone Company service center. Mechanized methods shall include all other methods. If a request utilizing a mechanized method results in manual processing, the mechanized nonrecurring charge shall apply upon completion of the request.

4.3 IntraLATA Presubscription (cont'd)

(F) IntraLATA Presubscription Charges (cont'd)

(1) Application of Charges (cont'd)

Presubscription Charges per Section 4.2 of Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 2 and IntraLATA Presubscription Charges, as set forth in (F)(2) apply when the subscriber simultaneously changes the carrier(s) selected for IntraLATA and InterLATA usage calls.

Subscribers may designate that they do not want to select a carrier. This choice is considered a valid selection and IntraLATA Presubscription Charges will apply to any subsequent change.

This charge is billed to the usage subscriber of record for a Telephone Company Network Access Line, except as set forth in (F)(1) preceding.

4.7 Service Provider Number Portability Service (SPNP) Monthly Charge Exclusion

Service Provider Number Portability Service (SPNP) Monthly Charges do not apply in the Wisconsin jurisdiction.

5.1 Except as otherwise provided below, provisions in Section 5 of the Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 relevant to intrastate service provided in the state of Wisconsin apply to service provided under this tariff.

5.2 Local Exchange Toll Provider Exceptions

Access Orders are not required for Switched Access Services provided to a local exchange carrier that is providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier, except where the customer requires new NXX(s) to be opened or existing NXX(s) to be deleted for 900 service.

Requirements for customers for Feature Group C and D Switched Access Service to specify the number of busy hour minutes of capacity (BHMC) from the customer's premises to the end office specified in Section 5.2 of Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 do not apply to a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier.

5.3 UNE to Access Conversions

The UNE to access conversion language found in F.C.C. No. 2, Section 5.1.1. only applies to UNE to interstate access conversions.

6 SWITCHED ACCESS SERVICE

6.1 Except as otherwise provided below, regulations and rates in Section 6 of the Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 relevant to intrastate service provided in the state of Wisconsin apply to service provided under this tariff.

6.2 Local Exchange Toll Provider Exceptions

6.2.1 General

Switched Access Service provided to a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier is provided between an end user's premises and the point of meeting with the local exchange carrier.

6.2.2 Switched Access Service Arrangements and Manner of Provision

Feature Group C Switched Access is available to a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier. Feature Group A, Feature Group B and Feature Group D Switched Access is not available to a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA as an interexchange carrier.

When 900 Access is provided to a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier, service will be provisioned in accordance with the technical characteristics available with Feature Group C.

6.2.3 Rate Categories - Switched Transport

Where Switched Transport is provided to a local exchange carrier that is providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier, only 50 percent of the Tandem-Switched Termination element applies, except where the switched transport facility termination is provided by Wisconsin Bell, LLC at both ends.

6.2.4 Description of Feature Group C Switched Access Service

Where Feature Group C Switched Access is provided to a local exchange carrier that is providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier, NXX codes served by offices subtending an access tandem (Sector tandem) may be accessed through a Principal tandem.

6 SWITCHED ACCESS SERVICE

6.2 Local Exchange Toll Provider Exceptions (Cont'd)

6.2.5 Measuring Access Minutes

For originating 900 Access Service provided a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier from an equal access office, chargeable originating access minutes are derived from recorded minutes in the same manner as 900 Access minutes from non-equal access offices.

6.2.6 Mileage Measurement

Where Switched Access is provided to a local exchange carrier that is providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier, the Tandem-Switched Facility will be calculated as the airline distance, using the V&H coordinate method, between the end office switch where the call carried by the switched transport originates and the end office switch where the call terminates, times a billing percentage reflecting the portion of the total switched transport distance provided by Wisconsin Bell, LLC and/or another local exchange carrier associated with Wisconsin Bell, LLC for purposes of provision of Switched Access Service. A single billing percentage will apply to all traffic, by type, between the same two end offices. Separate billing percentages are applicable for direct distance dialed (DDD), Operator, and WATS traffic.

6.2.7 IntraLATA Presubscription Implementation Charge

The IntraLATA Presubscription Implementation Charge is a \$0.0022 per minute of use charge that is assessed to recover the Telephone Company's costs associated with the implementation of IntraLATA Presubscription as described in Section 4.3 preceding. The charge is assessed to the customer based on originating IntraLATA Switched Access usage.

The IntraLATA Presubscription Implementation Charge becomes effective July 1, 1997 and will remain in effect for three years.

7.2 Local Exchange Toll Provider Exceptions

7.2.1 General

Special Access Service furnished to a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier provides a transmission path to connect a customer designated premises for two-point services, or premises for multi-point service, and the point of meeting with the local exchange carrier.

7.2.2 Rate Categories - Channel Mileage

For Special Access Service provided to a local exchange carrier providing service as an interexchange carrier, the channel Mileage rate category provides for the transmission facilities between a serving wire center associated with a customer designated premises and the point of meeting with the local exchange carrier, between two Telephone Company Hubs or between a Telephone Company Hub and the point of meeting with the local exchange carrier. Where the Channel Mileage reflects facilities to the point of meeting with a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier, the technical characteristics of the channel normally defined at the Point of Termination are defined by a standard channel interface defined at the first wire center of such local exchange carrier.

7.2.3 Mileage Measurement - Channel Mileage

The mileage used to determine the monthly rate for the Channel Mileage provided to a local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier is calculated as the airline distance between the serving wire center of a customer designated premises for access and the first wire center in the area of the local exchange carrier providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier, or a Telephone Company Hub and the first wire center in the area of the local exchange carrier. The mileage is calculated between the points outlined above using the V&H procedures as applied under Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2. The mileage billed is the mileage calculated as stated above, times a billing percentage established for the route.

8 SPECIALIZED NETWORK SERVICE

8.1 Except as otherwise provided below, regulations and rates in Section 8 of the Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 relevant to intrastate service provided in the state of Wisconsin apply to service provided under this tariff.

8.2 Exceptions

Section 8.5.1.1 of the Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 2 does not apply. Ameritech Frame Relay is limited to circuits in place as of November 26, 1999, and will be available only until July 4, 2000, at which time the service will no longer be available. No changes will be permitted to any existing circuit.

13.3 Miscellaneous Services

13.3.1 Public Telephone Carrier Selection Service Arrangements

(A) General

Service arrangements that allow convenient user selection of an interexchange carrier for completion of an end user's call are provided at selected public telephone locations. Two general types of service are available to interexchange carriers (customers) under this tariff. Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service requires the end user to depress a carrier specific button located on the public telephone station. Card Reader Automatic Carrier Selection Service requires the use of a carrier provided magnetic-card containing the carrier's identity.

Service is provided in accordance with the following provisions which apply in addition to, or in lieu of, the regulations contained in Section 2 of Ameritech Operating Companies F.C.C. Tariff No. 2.

(B) Regulation and Description of Service

(1) Description of Service

(a) Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service

Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service is an arrangement that allows selection of an interexchange carrier by depression of a button located on a panel associated with a public telephone station. A button is identified with the logo of each customer subscribing to the service. Depression of the button initiates the carrier's access code to the network and will result in connection to the interexchange carrier's service. Two Select-a-Carrier arrangements are offered. Arrangement 1 is suitable for carriers utilizing Feature Group A Switched Access. Arrangement 2 is suitable for carriers utilizing Feature Group B Switched Access.

(b) Card Reader Automatic Carrier Selection Service

Card Reader Automatic Carrier Selection Service is an arrangement that allows selection of an interexchange carrier through insertion of the interexchange carrier's magnetic striped card into the card reader device. A sign is provided identifying the logo of each customer's card subscribing to the service.

Insertion and removal of the card initiates auto dialing of the carrier's access code to the network and will result in connection to the interexchange exchange carrier's service. The billing number encoded on the card is stored, then downloaded upon a signal from the customer after the user dials the called number. Card Reader Automatic Carrier Selection Service is suitable for carriers utilizing Feature B, D or 800 Switched Access.

(c) Subscription Areas

Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service and Card Reader Automatic Carrier Selection Service are offered only at public coinless telephone stations selected by the Telephone Company within defined subscription areas. Customers must subscribe to service at each station established as a service location within a given subscription area. In the case of Select-a-Carrier Service, the description of the subscription area and the number and location of stations will be identified at the time of initial subscription, except that stations may be added or deleted at the sole option of the Telephone Company during the subscription period, provided that the number of stations will not exceed a maximum number established for the area at the time of initial subscription. In the case of Card Selection Service, the subscription area will encompass all stations in a LATA equipped to provide the service. Addition or deletion of stations during the subscription period will be identified to customers as they occur. In the case of Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service, a proposed subscription area will be established only where a minimum of three customers subscribe to service.

(2) Subscription Period

Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service and Card Reader Automatic Carrier Selection Service in a subscription area are provided for an initial 12-month subscription period applicable to each area. Customers must subscribe for the full 12-month subscription period, except that a customer may be added to existing stations in an established area upon payment of an installation charge for subsequent addition. In the event of such addition, the initial subscription period for that customer will be the remainder of the initial subscription period for the area. Following expiration of the initial subscription period for the area, at the option of the Telephone Company, service may be continued on a month-to-month basis.

(4) Carrier Logo and Logo Position

The customer shall be responsible for supplying a camera-ready copy of its logo or graphics designating such logo in the dimensions required by the Telephone Company. The dimension and style will be dependent upon whether the logo or graphics are to be utilized to identify the Carrier's Select-a-Carrier button or in the signage or instructions associated with the Card Selection Service. The position of a customer's logo on the Select-a-Carrier Service panel will be established by lottery at the inception of the initial subscription for the individual subscription area. The position of a customer's logo on the signage or instructions associated with Card Reader Automatic Carrier Selection Service will be established by lottery at the inception of the initial subscription for the initial subscription area and will be the same for all subscription areas. Customers added during a subscription period will be positioned contiguous to pre-existing customers. Where a customer changes its logo and requests the Telephone Company to change materials utilizing the logo, the customer requesting the change will be responsible for payment of charges based on the actual costs incurred by the Telephone Company in accomplishing the change.

(4) Access Codes

The customer must provide the Telephone Company with its access code at inception of service. When a customer changes the access code applicable to the provision of its service from a Select-a-Carrier station where it has been subscribing to service, the customer will be responsible for payment of a charge equivalent to a service order charge for change and a central office work charge as shown in Section 3 of P.S.C. of W. No. 1 for each area affected. When a customer changes the access code applicable to the provision of its service from a Card Selection station where it has been subscribing to service, the customer will be responsible, per station, for payment of a service order charge and premises work charges equivalent to those for Semi-Public Telephone Service. The Telephone Company will complete the access code changes on all stations in 30 days. The customer shall provide to the Telephone Company a suitable number of the customer's cards for installation and maintenance purposes.

(5) Change in Type of Service

The customer may change from Type 1 service to Type 2 Select-a-Carrier service during the subscription period. Charges for such change are the charges associated with the attendant access code change.

(6) Allowance for Service Interruptions

No credit to monthly charges apply for interruptions affecting Select-a-Carrier Service or Card Selection Service.

(7) Discontinuance of Service

In the event that a customer discontinues either the Select-a-Carrier Service or the Card Selection Service during a subscription period, the customer shall be required to pay monthly charges for the remainder of the subscription period. In addition, for Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service, a termination charge of \$45.00 applies for each station at which service is discontinued. In the event that all customers agree to simultaneously discontinue Select-a-Carrier Charge-a-Call Service, each customer shall be liable only for the monthly charges for the remainder of the subscription period.

Non-recurring Charges for installation apply as set forth in (B) following. In addition, Service Order Charges as set forth in Section 3 of P.S.C. of W. No. 1 apply for establishment, additions or changes to service.

13.3.2 Interexchange Carrier Public Service Line

The following provisions apply in addition to, or in lieu of, the regulations contained in Section 2 Ameritech Operating Companies F.C.C. Tariff No. 2.

(A) General

(1) Description of Service

In central offices where facilities permit, the Telephone Company will provide an Interexchange Carrier Public Service Line (ICPSL). An Interexchange Carrier Public Service Line is a local exchange service line provided at the request of the customer at a location accessible to the general public for connection to a non-coin public telephone instrument provided by the carrier.

The use of interexchange facilities, Foreign Central Office or Foreign Exchange Service to provide an ICPSL is not permitted.

An ICPSL may only be used to originate local, intraLATA and interLATA calls. Incoming calling is not provided. Completion of interLATA calls requires use of Switched Access Services obtained by interexchange carriers under the appropriate access tariff. Local and intraLATA calls will be completed and billed by the Telephone Company at appropriate tariff rates.

- (a) Provide access to 911 Emergency Service (where available);
- (b) Provide access to "O" Operator ("O"-minus) to allow calls to public safety agencies (e.g., police, fire);
- (c) Comply with relevant statutes governing public telephone installations.

(4) Payment of Rates, Charges and Deposits

In lieu of the provisions for payment contained in Section 2 of Ameritech Operating Companies F.C.C. Tariff No. 2, regulations contained in P.S.C. of W. No. 1 apply as appropriate.

(B) Rates and Charges

An Interexchange Carrier Public Service Line is provided at the rates and charges for Semi-Public Coinless Telephone Service as set forth in P.S.C. of W. No. 1. Rates are applicable depending upon the exchange wherein service is provided. Non-recurring installation charges apply in addition to monthly charges.

20 BILLING AND COLLECTION SERVICES

20.1 General

Billing and Collection Services may be provided under an individual contract with an individual customer subject to the conditions in 20.6.2 following.

Where service is provided under an individual agreement, service undertakings, service descriptions, charges, and terms and conditions will be tailored to the needs of the individual customer and will be contained in the individual contractual agreement. Provisions of the agreement apply in lieu of any provisions applicable to Billing and Collection Services found elsewhere in this tariff.

- (2) Within 20 days after a contract or amendment to a contract established under this tariff has been executed the Telephone Company shall submit to the Commission written notice of the general nature of the contract and the parties to the contract.

1 APPLICATION OF TARIFF

1.1 Except as otherwise provided below, regulations in Section 1 of the Ameritech Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No 2 relevant to intrastate service provided in the state of Wisconsin apply to service provided under this tariff.

1.2 Local Exchange Toll Provider Exceptions

In addition to the service areas defined by the Rate Centers specified in Section 14 of this tariff, this tariff also applies to the provision of Switched Access Service to customer locations in the exchange service area of local exchange companies associated with Wisconsin Bell, LLC for purposes of provision of Switched Access Service to a local exchange company providing intraLATA service as an interexchange carrier.
